You have requested to drill this well at an unorthodox oil well location described above in the referenced pool or formation. This location is governed by statewide Rule 19.15.15.9.A NMAC, which provides for 40-acre units with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is less than 330 feet from a unit outer boundary.

An unorthodox location is required in order to avoid existing pipelines, sand and gravel pit, one plugged and abandoned well, overhead power lines, roads, and pump jacks.
