TRANSCRIPT OF HEARING



MR. NUTTER: The Hearing will come to order, please.

The next case will be Case Number 4318.

MR. HATCH: Case 4318: Application of Pan American Petroleum Corporation for a non-standard gas proration unit, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. BUELL: For Pan American Petroleum Corporation, Guy Buell. We have one witness, Mr. Hosford.

MR. HATCH: I believe the record will show he has already been sworn.

MR. BUELL: And qualified in the previous case.

MR. NUTTER: It will show we got a letter of appearance on your behalf, too.

#### PATRICK E. HOSFORD

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

#### BY MR. BUELL:

Q Please state your full name for the record, Mr. Hosford.

A Patrick E. Hosford.

Q All right, sir. At the outset what is
Pan American recommending to the Commission here today?

A Pan American is recommending the formation of a non-standard gas unit in the Jalmat pool comprised of the north half of Section 7, Township 24 South, Range 37 East. This is further identified as Pan American Meyers "B" Federal R/A.

Q All right, sir. Directing your attention to what has been identified as our Exhibit Number One how have you delineated this proposed non-standard unit on that exhibit?

A This non-standard unit is delineated with a red border around the 320 acres.

Q What other data are reflected on this exhibit?

A The exhibit further reflects the wells producing in the Jalmat gas pool. These are colored orange.

Q All right, sir. Now, within the confines of the proposed non-standard unit I notice there are two wells. Would you identify those for the record?

A Yes. There is the Meyers "B" Federal Royalty
Count A Well Number One completed in Unit D of Section 7
and there is Meyers "B" Federal Royalty Count A Well Number

Ten located in Unit G of Section 7.

- Q Are both of these wells capable wells?
- A No, sir. The Well Number One is a very capable well; however, Well Number Ten is not capable of making the allowable of a 160-acre gas well.
- Q All right, sir. Is Well Number One capable enough to make the entire 320-acre unit anticipated gas allowable?
  - A Yes, sir; it is.
- Q What is your recommendation to the Commission as to if they should approve this application how the 320-acre unit allowable would be produced?
- A It is our recommendation to the Commission that the 320-acre allowable be produced in any proportion from either of these two wells on this non-standard gas unit. With the understanding that Pan American will attempt to produce and will produce Well Number Ten until we do reach the economic limit on this well.
- Q You think if Well Number Ten is produced to its economic limit that the -- it could recover gas that might not be recovered by the Number One well?
  - A Yes, sir; it is possible.
- Q All right, sir. Do you feel that this recommendation will protect the correlative rights of the

owners of interest under this 320-acre unit?

A Yes, sir. I would say so insofar as the two units that now exist being the northeast of Section 7 being one non-standard 160-acre unit, and the northwest of Section 7 being a non-standard 160-acre unit. The northeast unit is not producing the full allowable of a 160-acre unit at this time due to the well Number Ten being a non-capable well.

By the combining of these two non-standard 160-acre units into a proposed non-standard 320-acre unit, these two wells producing on a unit well basis will be capable of producing the allowable of a 320-acre unit.

- Q Is all the acreage in the proposed 320-acre non-standard unit from one basic Federal lease?
  - A Yes, sir; it is.
- Q All right, sir. There appear to be many similar units in the Jalmat pool where more than one well is producing on a unit.
- A Yes. In looking at the proration schedule there indicates to be six gas units having more than one well producing on a non-standard unit in these cases. However, there is one standard unit in the Jalmat Gas Pool. I would

like to bring this out. Only one, that being a 640-acre standard gas unit and it does have three gas wells producing on it.

Q Do you feel that approval of this request will serve conservation by preventing waste and will protect the correlative rights not only of the owners of interest of the proposed unit, but also the owners of interest in the Jalmat pool?

A Yes, sir; I do.

MR. BUELL: That's all we have, Mr. Examiner.

We would like to formally offer Pan American's Exhibit Number One.

MR. NUTTER: Pan Am's Exhibit Number One will be admitted in evidence.

(Whereupon, Pan American's Exhibit Number One was admitted in evidence.)

#### CROSS EXAMINATION

#### BY MR. NUTTER:

 $\Omega$  Mr. Hosford, do you happen to know the status of the two proration units as far as under-production, over-production?

A Yes, sir. I do have a fairly up-to-date record of this. I can find it here in my records.

The Well Number One which is the northwest 160-acre non-standard unit, is over-produced, or was over-produced going into January of 1970 to the tune of fifty-two thousand MCF.

Well Number Ten, on the other hand, was under-produced to the tune of seventy-five thousand five hundred MCF into January, 1970.

Q It did have a status then; it wasn't a marginal well?

A That's right. It did have a status. In December it carried an allowable of -- a top allowable of ninety-nine sixteen MCF and only produced twenty-nine oh seven.

Q Is it agreeable with Pan American that the Commission in any order that it may enter approving consolidation of these two units would take the net combined status of the two units and form a composit status for the 320-acre unit?

A Yes, sir. I would say so.

MR. NUTTER: Is there any further questions of this witness?

MR. HATCH: Do you have the orders or the administrative orders that authorize this handy?

THE WITNESS: No, sir. I don't think I happen to have them handy; probably in a suitcase.

MR. NUTTER: They are old wells.

MR. BUELL: They are old wells. That would be my guess.

MR. NUTTER: If there are not any further questions, the witness may be excused.

Do you have anything further, Mr. Buell?
MR. BUELL: No, sir; I do not.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case Number 4318?

We will take the case under advisement.

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

NOW, on this <a href="lith">11th</a> day of March, 1970, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

#### FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Pan American Petroleum Corporation, is the owner and operator of two 160-acre non-standard gas proration units comprising the NW/4 and the NB/4 of Section 7, Town-ship 24 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Jalmat Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the NW/4 of said Section 7 is presently dedicated to applicant's Myers "B" Federal R/A A Well No. 1, located in Unit D of said Section 7, and that the ME/4 of said Section 7 is presently dedicated to applicant's Myers "B" Federal R/A A Well No. 10, located in Unit G of said Section 7.
- (4) That the applicant now neeks the consolidation of the two existing non-standard gas proration units to form one 320-acre

non-standard gas proration unit comprising the N/2 of said Section 7, said unit to be simultaneously dedicated to its aforesaid Myers "B" Federal R/A A Wells Nos. 1 and 10.

- (5) That the applicant further seeks authority to produce the allowable assigned to the unit from either of the aforesaid wells in any proportion.
- (6) That the proposed non-standard gas proration unit can be efficiently and economically drained and developed by the Myers "B" Federal R/A A Wells Nos. 1 and 10.
- (7) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the Jalmat Gas Pool, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That, effective April 1, 1970, a 320-acre non-standard gas proration unit in the Jalmat Gas Pool comprising the N/2 of Section 7, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico, is hereby established and simultaneously dedicated to the Pan American Petroleum Corporation Myers "B" Federal R/A A Well No. 1, located in Unit D of said Section 7, and to the Pan American Petroleum Corporation Myers "B" Federal R/A A Well No. 10, located in Unit G of said Section 7.
- (2) That the allowable assigned to the above-described non-standard gas proration unit shall be based upon the unit size of 320 acres; that the operator may produce the allowable assigned to the unit from the subject wells in any proportion; and that the status of the consolidated unit shall be the combined status, as of April 1, 1970, of the two units being consolidated.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
