It was not considered feasible to re-enter these wells, and consequently, there is no well on the two lots to recover the oil which underlies it. Therefore, a well number 48 is proposed to be drilled, so as to recover the oil underlying these two lots, which is estimated to be approximately 98,000 barrels. Now, well number 49 is being drilled to improve the pattern. You will note that number 43 is only 660 feet from number 47, and about 900 feet from number 44. Consequently, this well is expected to preserve early 10 water breakthrough and as a matter of fact, has experienced 11 early water breakthrough so that the area between the 12 number 43 and number 40, which is up in lot 11 will not 13 be efficiently set. 14 We therefore propose to drill well number 39, which is 15 more centrally located from the 3 injection wells around 16 it, and it is estimated that this change in location, 17 the drilling of well number 49 will recover in additional 18 55 thousand barrels of oil. 19 Now, this additional oil you are talking about is oil that 20 would not otherwise be under the present injection pattern; 21 is that correct? 22 Correct.
