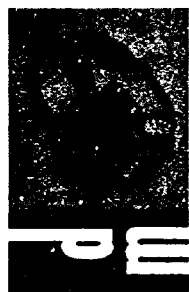

1 MR. HATCH: Case 4582, application of Continental
2 Oil Company for an unorthodox oil well location and
3 amendment of order number R-2940, Lea County, New Mexico.

4 MR. JASON KELLAHIN: If the Examiner please, Jason
5 Kellahin, appearing for the applicant. We have one witness
6 I would like to have sworn.

7 (V. T. Lyon sworn)

8 DIRECT EXAMINATION

9 BY MR. KELLAHIN:

10 Q Would you state your name, please.

11 A V. T. Lyon, L-y-o-n.

12 Q By whom are you employed and in what position?

13 A Continental Oil Company, Conservation Coordinator in
14 Hobbs, Division office.

15 Q In connection with your work as Conservation Coordinator,
16 have you appeared before the Oil Conservation Commission
17 and made your qualifications a matter of record.

18 A Yes, I have.

19 MR. KELLAHIN: Are the witness's qualifications
20 acceptable?

21 MR. UTZ: Yes, they are.

22 Q (Mr. Kellahin continuing) Mr. Lyon, briefly, what is
23 proposed by the application in case 4582?

24 A Case number 4582 is the application of Continental Oil
25 Company for approval of an unorthodox location for a

1 producing well in the Southeast Monument -- Unit
2 Permian Well number 91 and for amendment Order No. 2940
3 to permit additional and unorthodox locations within
4 the Southeast Monument Unit, Skaggs-Greyburg Pool water-
5 flood project.

6 Q Referring to what has been marked as Applicant's Exhibit
7 Number One, would you identify and discuss that exhibit.

8 A Yes sir. Exhibit number one is a location plat showing
9 that portion of Skaggs-Greyburg Pool lying within the
10 Southeast Monument Unit. It is shown by the heavy dashed
11 line. In addition to the area shown on the plat, it contains
12 the rest of Sections 14, 23, and 26 and the East half of
13 the East half of Sections 15, 22 and 27. The Unit contains
14 approximately 5403 acres. We show on the plat, the Skaggs-
15 Greyburg Wells. The injection wells are shown on the
16 triangles circumscribed around them and the ownership and
17 location of offset wells and leases are shown to the best
18 of our knowledge and belief. Well ninety-one, which is the
19 subject of this hearing is shown circled in red and at a
20 location 2620 feet from the North line and 1300 feet from
21 the West line of Section 19. The Section 19 is on the
22 Western edge of the Township and consequently, the West
23 half of the West half of Section 19 is irregular. Lot
24 number two is 1334 feet wide, so that this well is being
25 produced for drilling thirty-four feet from the Eastern

1 boundary and twenty feet from the Southern boundary
2 of this lot number two.

3 This water-flood project was authorized by order number
4 R-1710 in June of 1960 and the pilot flood has been
5 expanded under the provision of rule 701 and then was
6 expanded to full scale under Order No. R-2940 in July of
7 1965. Well number ninety-one is being drilled to
8 evaluate the possibility of recovering the additional oil
9 by in-fill drilling.

10 If this project is successful, we anticipate drilling
11 additional in-fill wells and as a consequence of this
12 possibility and in order to avoid the administrative
13 burden of the Commission for having additional hearings and
14 so forth we would like to have authority to drill these
15 wells by administrative procedures.

16 Q Would you notify the offset operators on such wells as
17 are drilled on outer proration units?

18 A Yes. We would do this.

19 Q In your opinion, would the granting of this application
20 prevent waste and result in the recovery of oil that would
21 not otherwise be recovered?

22 A Yes. We estimate that well number nine-one will recover
23 additional thirty-three thousand barrels of oil and this
24 oil otherwise would not be recovered and in my opinion the
25 granting of this application will result in the recovery

1 of otherwise unrecoverable oil and will not impair
2 correlative rights.

3 Q Was Exhibit one prepared under your supervision?

4 A Yes.

5 MR. KELLAHIN: At this time I would like to offer
6 in evidence Exhibit number one.

7 MR. UTZ: Without objection, Exhibit number one
8 will be entered into the record of this case.

9 MR. KELLAHIN: That is our case, Mr. Utz.

10 MR. UTZ: Any questions of the witness.

11 MR. HATCH: Continental has an administrative
12 procedure in one or more other projects, but is there a
13 limitation on how close they can be to the boundary?

14 MR. LYON: Right.

15 MR. HATCH: Do you remember what that is?

16 MR. LYON: I think it is five feet.

17 MR. HATCH: I know to those inner boundarys, no closer
18 than five feet, but the outer boundarys -- it seems to me
19 there was some limitation.

20 MR. LYON: I don't remember that we specifically -- it
21 might have been 330 feet.

22 MR. HATCH: I was thinking that it was. Would that
23 be satisfactory in this?

24 MR. LYON: Yes, certainly.

25 MR. UTZ: Mr. Lyon, how many additional administrative

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approved wells do you anticipate you have?

MR. LYON: At the present time we anticipate probably
four more.

MR. ITZ: Any other questions of the witness?
You may be excused.

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on August 18, 1971, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Elvis A. Utz.

NOW, on this 25th day of August, 1971, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, is the operator of the SEMU Waterflood Project, Skaggs-Grayburg Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

(3) That the applicant seeks authority to drill its SEMU Permian Well No. 91 as a producing oil well at an unorthodox location 2620 feet from the North line and 1300 feet from the West line of Section 19, Township 20 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Skaggs-Grayburg Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, as an infill well in the SEMU Waterflood Project area.

(4) That the proposed unorthodox location is necessary to provide an efficient oil producing pattern.

(5) That the applicant also seeks the establishment of an administrative procedure whereby the Secretary-Director of the Commission may authorize additional producing wells at orthodox and unorthodox locations within said SEMU Waterflood Project area as may be necessary to complete an efficient production and injection pattern.

(6) That approval of the requested administrative procedure will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the oil in the Skaggs-Grayburg Pool, provided said wells are drilled no closer than 330 feet to the outer boundary of the Southeast Monument Unit Area nor closer than 10 feet to any quarter-quarter section or subdivision inner boundary.

(7) That the subject waterflood project should continue to be governed by the provisions of Rules 701, 702, and 703 of the Commission Rules and Regulations insofar as said rules are not inconsistent with this order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the applicant, Continental Oil Company, is hereby authorized to drill its SEMU Permian Well No. 91, a producing oil well, at an unorthodox location 2620 feet from the North line and 1300 feet from the West line of Section 19, Township 20 South, Range 38 East, NMPM, Skaggs-Grayburg Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, as an infill well in its SEMU Waterflood Project Area.

(2) That the subject waterflood project shall continue to be governed by the provisions of Rules 701, 702, and 703 of the Commission Rules and Regulations;

PROVIDED HOWEVER, that the Secretary-Director of the Commission may approve such additional producing wells at orthodox and unorthodox locations within the SEMU Waterflood Project area as may be necessary to complete an efficient production and injection pattern; provided said wells are drilled no closer than 330 feet to the outer boundary of the Southeast Monument Unit Area nor closer than 10 feet to any quarter-quarter section or subdivision inner boundary, and provided that the application therefor has been filed in accordance with Rule 701 B of the Commission Rules and Regulations.



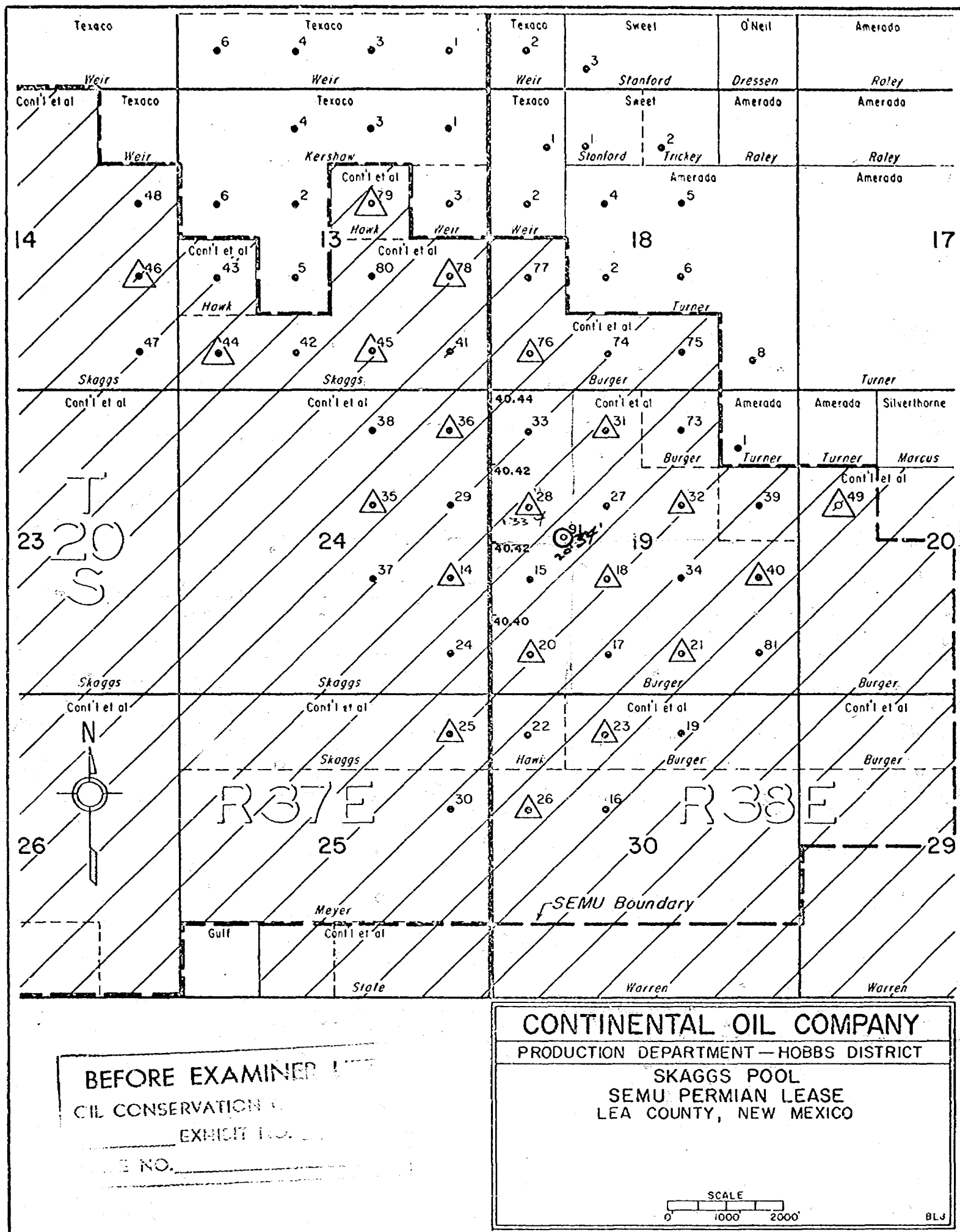



2. Applicant has heretofore installed a waterflood project in the Skaggs Grayburg Pool within the area of the Upper Permian Participating Area of said Southeast Monument Unit. Said waterflood project was expanded under the provisions of Order No. R-2940.
3. In the interest of evaluating the feasibility of increasing oil recovery by drilling producing wells at infill locations, applicant desires to drill its SEMU Permian No. 91 at a location 2620' from the north line and 1300' from the west line of Section 19, Township 20 South, Range 38 East, Lea County, New Mexico.
4. Assuming additional infill drilling wells will prove to be economically feasible, applicant desires to secure administrative procedures for the approval of such wells and requests that Order No. R-2940 be amended so as to provide such procedures.

5. That the granting of this application will prevent waste and will not impair correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that this application be set for hearing before the Commission's duly appointed Examiner and that upon hearing an order be entered authorizing the unorthodox location and amending Order R-2940, both as described above.

(3) (4) That monthly progress reports of the subject waterflood project shall continue to be submitted to the Commission in accordance with Rules 704 and 1120 of the Commission Rules and Regulations.

(4) (5) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
