Permian Well number 91 and for amendment Order No. 2940

to permit additional and unorthodox locations within

the Southeast Monument Unit, Skaggs-Greyburg Pool waterflood project.

Referring to what has been marked as Applicant's Exhibit
Number One, would you identify and discuss that exhibit.

Yes sir. Exhibit number one is a location plat showing that portion of Skaggs-Greyburg Pool lying within the Southeast Monument Unit. It is shown by the heavy dashed line. In addition to the area shown on the plat, it contains the rest of Sections 14, 23, and 26 and the East half of the East half of Sections 15, 22 and 27. The Unit contains approximately 5403 acres. We show on the plat, the Skaggs-Greyburg Wells. The injection wells are shown on the triangles circumscribed around them and the ownership and location of offset wells and leases are shown to the best of our knowledge and belief. Well ninety-one, which is the subject of this hearing is shown circled in red and at a location 2620 feet from the North line and 1300 feet from the West line of Section 19. The Section 19 is on the Western edge of the Township and consequently, the West half of the West half of Section 19 is irregular. number two is 1334 feet wide, so that this well is being produced for drilling thirty-four feet from the Eastern

boundary and twenty feet from the Southern boundary of this lot number two.

This water-flood project was authorized by order number R-1710 in June of 1960 and the pilot flood has been expanded under the provision of pule 701 and then was expanded to full scale under Order No. R-2940 in July of 1965. Well number ninety-one is being drilled to evaluate the possibility of recovering the additional oil by in-fill drilling.

If this project is successful, we anticipate drilling additional in-fill wells and as a consequence of this possibility and in order to avoid the administrative burden of the Commission for having additional hearings and so forth we would like to have authority to drill these wells by administrative procedures.

- Would you notify the offset operaters on such wells as are drilled on outer proration units?
- A Yes. We would do this.
 - In your opinion, would the granting of this application prevent waste and result in the recovery of oil that would not otherwise be recovered?
 - Yes. We estimate that well number nine-one will recover additional thirty-three thousand barrels of oil and this oil otherwise would no be recovered and in my opinion the granting of this application will result in the recovery

of otherwise unrecoverable oil and will not impair correlative rights. Was Exhibit one prepared under your supervision? Yes. MR. KELLAHIN: At this time I would like to offer in evidence Exhibit number one. 6 MR. UTZ: Without objection, Exhibit number one will be entered into the record of this case. 8 MR. «KELLAHIN: That is our case, Mr. Utz. MR UTZ: Any questions of the witness. 10 MR. HATCH: Continental has an administrative 11 procedure in one or more other projects, but is there a 12 limitation on how close they can be to the boundary? 13 MR. LYON: Right. MR. HATCH: Do you remember what that is? 15 MR. LYON: I think it is five feet. 16 MR. 


