MR. NUTTER: Case No. 4632.

MR. HATCH: Case No. 4632. Application of Mobil Oil Corporation for an unorthodox gas well location, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. SPERLING: James E. Sperling of Modrall, Sperling, Roehl, Harris and Sisk, appearing for the Applicant, Mobil Oil Corporation and we have one witness.

(Witness sworn.)

JOHN SEEREY

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. SPERLING:

- Q Would you state your name, please?
- A John Seerey.
- Q Where do you live, Mr. Seerey, and by whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A I am employed as an Associate Engineer in the Proration Engineering Group of the Midland Division
 Office of Mobil Oil Corporation.
- Q Have you on any prior occasion testified as to your qualifications before the Commission?
 - A Yes, I have.

MR. SPERLING: Are the qualifications acceptable?
MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.

BY MR. SPERLING:

- Q What does Mobil seek in this Application?
- A Mobil Oil Corporation requests approval of the Commission for the dedication of the west half of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, Lea County, New Mexico to its Bridges State Well No. 133 in the North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool completed as an unorthodox location in this Unit.

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibits Nos. 1 through 5 were marked for identification.)

BY MR. SPERLING:

Q Mr. Hatch has kindly marked our Exhibits for us in this matter; would you please refer to what has been marked as Exhibit No. 1 in this matter?

A Exhibit 1 is a plat of Mobil's Bridges State
Lease in the North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool. The subject
Well No. 133 is shown in Unit "F" Section 14, Township
17 South, Range 34 East. The other Morrow Gas Wells in
the field are also shown on Exhibit 1. The area shown
within the dashed outline is that area presently designated to be in the North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool. Mobil's

presently proposed re-completion to the Morrow formation in the Bridges State Well No. 125 is shown by the orange triangle in Unit "H" Section 14.

Q I assume the yellow acreage on the exhibit represents Mobil's acreage in the area?

A Yes, sir.

Q Now, would you refer to Exhibit No. 2, please, and explain that?

A Exhibit No. 2 is a copy of the Form C-101 filed in December of 1969 for the Application to drill Well No. 133.

Q And Exhibit 3?

A Exhibit 3 is a copy of the original Form C-102 filed in December of 1969 for Well No. 133. This shows Well No. 133 to be located 2150 feet from the west line and 1880 feet from the north line.

(Whereupon, a discussion was held off the record.)

BY MR. SPERLING:

Q Mr. Seerey, I think you were explaining Exhibit 3 and the location of Well No. 133?

A Yes, sir. I had said that the well is 1880 feet from the north line of Section 14, Township 17

South, Range 34 East, Lea County, New Mexico. Exhibit 3 further shows the north half of Section 14 to be dedicated to Well No. 133.

- Q Is Well 133 in an orthodox location for the designated unit on Exhibit 3?
 - A Yes, sir, it is.
- Q Why is Mobil now seeking approval for an unorthodox location on Well No. 133?

Á On November 15th, 1971, Mobil submitted Application for permit and received approval from the Commission to deepen the Bridges State No. 125 to the Morrow formation. Well No. 125 is located 2180 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the east line of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, Lea County, New Mexico. The Application requested that the east half of Section 14 be dedicated to Well No. 125 and the well is an orthodox location to the east half of Section 14, however, to dedicate the east half of Section 14 to Well No. 125, we must revise the acreage dedicated to the subject well of this Hearing, Well No. 133, and now we seek to dedicate the west half of Section 14 to it as shown on Exhibit 4, the Form C-102 being submitted for Well No. 133. While Well 133 is an

orthodox location to the originally dedicated north half of Section 14, the same location becomes an unorthodox location when the west half of Section 14 is dedicated to it because it is 100 feet too close to the end boundary and 170 feet too close to the side boundary. It should be noted that the only location in the northwest quarter that Well No. 133 could have been located to qualify as an orthodox location in either the north half or west half of Section 14 would have been 1980 feet from the north and west lines of the Section. However, the Bridges State Well No. 65, the San Andres Well is located at that position.

Q Well, the deepening of Bridges State Well
No. 125 to the Morrow is the cause of Well No. 133 becoming
unorthodox. Why didn't you select another location for
the new Morrow well in the south half of Section 14?

A Considering the production history and the existing wells that we have in this pool in this area and the estimated drilling risk cost, Mobil feels that the recompletion of Well No. 125 is the only economical alternative for further development of the North Vacuum-Morrow Pool. To further explain this, I would point out that Well No. 125 is located in a position of maximum

well control in the area for the Morrow. If you would note on Exhibit No. 1, Well No. 125 has Morrow wells to all sides, north, south, east and west. The Morrow itself is a -- we look upon it as a single completion. All Morrows there shown are single completions. While other zones were tested, we found that the extreme pressure, high pressure, that the Morrow produces at is not conducive to dual production, and in some cases, we found the complete absence of the other deep zones, the Upper Penn, the Middle Penn and Wolfcamp, so basically, we view the Morrow as a single completion attempt and this influences the drilling cost. To further explain the other Morrow wells, I might scan Exhibit 1 and mention that Well 151 which would be a southwest offset to Well No. 125. By my notes it was completed in March of 1971 and it had a calculated open flow of 3.45 M.M.C.F. per day at that time. It has declined to 693 M.C.F. a day with 5 barrels of oil a day now. We found high water saturation in the Upper Penn, Middle Fenn and Wolfcamp in that well. To the other extreme, to the north of Well No. 125, you will see Well No. 126, and it was drilled in July of '68 or completed in July of '68 for, I believe, 1.65 M.M.C.F. per day at that time. At

this time it is producing 1532 M.C.F. a day with 88 barrels of oil.

Q So, it hasn't declined much?

A No, sir. This, to us, indicates the preferential production in the Morrow is to the north so far as Section 14 is concerned. In other words, we don't feel we can justify drilling in the south part of Section 14 as evidenced by the production of the south there.

Q What is your estimated cost of completing the Morrow Well at another location?

A \$315,000. which is considered all risk money. To re-enter Well No. 125 which was originally drilled to 10,600 foot T.E., the estimated cost deepened to the Morrow is \$180,000. which is risk money. The difference between the \$180,000. to \$315,000. represents to Mobil a \$135,000. difference in risk money; to further complete the Morrow.

- Q Plus the prospect of getting a better well?
- A Yes, sir. At least, longer-lived.
- Q Do you have anything further to add in connection with the Morrow prospects in this area?
 - A No, sir, I believe that about covers it.
 - Q I notice that the Shell acreage to the northwest

of the proposed location, have you obtained a waiver from Shell as to this Application?

A Exhibit 5 is Shell's signed waiver showing Shell as the offset operator to the subject well has no objection to the Commission granting Mobil approval for the unorthodox location requested.

- Q At Well No. 133?
- A Yes, sir.
- Q Do you have anything further?
- A No, sir.

MR. SPERLING: That is all that we have at this time. I would like to offer Exhibits 1 through 5, please?

MR. NUTTER: Mobil Exhibits 1 through 5 will be admitted in evidence.

(Whereupon, Applicant's Exhibits Nos. 1 through 5 were offered and admitted in evidence.)

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have any questions of Mr. Seerey?

You may be excused.

(Witness dismissed.)

MR. NUTTER: Do you have anything further, Mr. Sperling?

MR. SPERLING: No, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case No. 4632?

We will take the case under advisement and recess the Hearing.

(Whereupon, a recess was held at 10:09 A.M.)

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on December 1, 1971, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Mutter.

NOW, on this 9th day of December, 1971, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Mobil Oil Corporation, seeks authority to dedicate the W/2 of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, HMPM, to its Bridges State Well No. 133, situate at an unorthodox location for said unit 1880 feet from the North line and 2150 feet from the West line of said Section 14, North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (3) That approval of the subject application will permit the development of two 320-acre standard gas provation units within the boundaries of said Section 14.
- (4) That approval of the unorthodox location will not violate correlative rights and will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the Morth Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool, will prevent the economic

loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and otherwise prevent waste.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That an unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved for the Mobil Oil Corporation's Bridges State Well Mo. 133 in the Morth Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool at a location 1880 feet from the Morth line and 2150 feet from the West line of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, MMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
- (2) That the applicant, Mobil Oil Corporation, is hereby authorised to dedicate the W/2 of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, to the above-described Bridges State Well Mo. 133.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on December 1 , 191, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Nutter

NOW, on this <u>day of December</u>, 1971, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Mobil Oil Corporation seeks authority to dedicate the W/2 of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, to its Bridges State Well No. 133, situate at an unorthodox location for said unit North Vacuum Norrow Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

- require the well to be located not closer than 600 feet to the nearest side boundary of the dedicated tract por closer than 1980 feet to the hearest end boundary for closer than 330 feet to any quarter-guarter section or subdivision inner boundary.
- (3) That approval of the subject application will permit the development of two 320-acre standard gas proration units within the boundaries of said Section 14.
- That approval of the unorthodox location will not viblate correlative rights and will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and otherwise prevent waste.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That an unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved for the Mobil Oil Corporation's Bridges State Well No. 133 in the North Vacuum-Morrow Gas Pool at a location 1880 feet from the North line and 2150 feet from the West line of Section 14, Township 17 South, Range 34 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.
