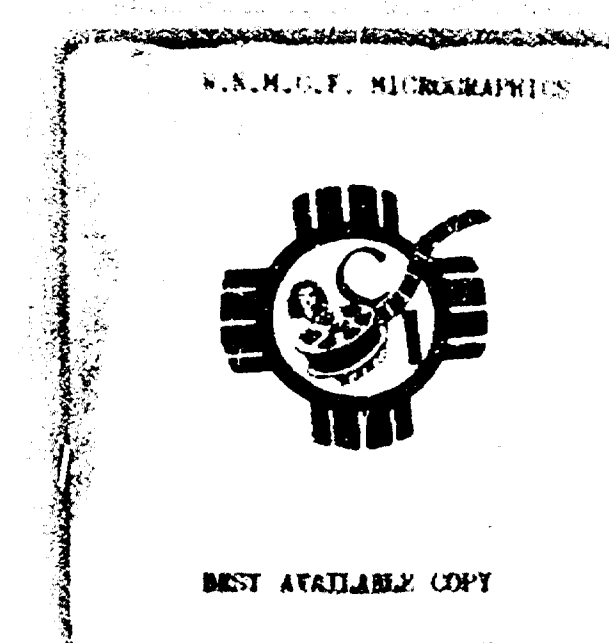

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on January 3, 1974
at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Daniel S. Butler.

NOW, on this day of January, 1974, the Commission,
a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record,
and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised
in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by
law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject
matter thereof.

(2) That the applicant, Atlantic Richfield Company, seeks
approval for the simultaneous dedication of four wells to a
standard 640-acre unit comprising all of Section 15, Township
22 South, Range 36 East, Jalisco Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

(3) That the applicant, Atlantic Richfield Company, is
the operator of a standard 640-acre gas production
unit comprising all of Section 15, Township 22 South,
Range 36 East, Jalisco Gas Pool, Lea County, New
Mexico which is simultaneously dedicated to it.

McDonald State Wells No. 13, 14, and 15
located in said Section 15.

(3) That said wells are capable of only
emergency production.

(4) That the applicant seeks approval for
the simultaneous dedication of four wells
to a standard 640-acre gas production unit
comprising all of Section 15, Township 22 South,
Range 36 East, Jalisco Gas Pool, Lea County, New
Mexico which is simultaneously dedicated to it.
The wells are located at a non-standard
location 660 feet from the North line and 1780 feet
from the West line of said Section 15.
