Applicant, in the above-styled case, seeks an order authorizing the formation of a 160-acre unorthodox gas proration unit as an exception pursuant to provisions of Rule 7(a) of Order R-370-A and consisting of 3/2 NE/4 and N/2 SE/4 of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, adjacent to the Eumont Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS

MR. MORRELL: My name is Foster Morrell, Petroleum Consultant.

Roswell, New Mexico, appearing on behalf of Mr. C. E. Aikman in

Case No. 701 for the consideration of the application of Mr. Aikman

for approval of 160 acro unorthodox gas provation unit, being adjacent

to the Eumont Gas Pool, consisting of the south half of the northeast

quarter and the north half of the southeast quarter, Section 7,

Township 21 South, Range 37 Mast, Lea County, New Mexico. I have

here what is marked Exhibit No. 1 in Gase 701, on which is shown the

gas wells located in Section 7 and 8 in Township 21 South, Range 37

Bast. On this map outlined in red i, the 160 acre unorthodox gas

provation unit requested by Mr. Aikman.

The gas wells shown thereon are as follows: The Claude 4. 11 - man No. 1 Currie, located 660 feet from the east line and 1080 feet from the south line of Section 7. This well was completed July 22, 1953 at a total death of 1799 feet, pluyed back to 3630 feet. Gas is produced through casing perforation from 3565 to 3630 in the

three million cubic feet a day with a chutic presence of 1000 nounds. Ocs is currently being cold from this well to the 30 Pero latural Gas-Company. There is also shown on this exhibit one the Yeville G. Penrose well Aives, located 660 feet from the east line and 330 feet from the south line of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 37 Mast. This well was completed September 23, 1053 at a total depth of 3602 feet. The gas producing interval is from the 3524 to 3602 feet in the Queen formation. The initial potential of the well after treatment with mud acid and stratafac was 3,221,000 cubic feet of gas per day with a shutin pressure of 1000 nounds. Gas is not being produced from the well at the present time.

The third well shown on Exhibit 1 is Neville G. Penrose, Inc. well #2, Alves, located 1980 feet from the north line and 1980 feet from the east line of Section 18, Township 21 South, Range 37 Hast. This well was completed October 30, 1953 at a total depth of 3828 fleet. plugged back to 3609 feet. The gas producing interval is from 3490 to 3595 feet in the Queen formation. The initial potential of the well after treatment with acid and shot with nitroglycerin was one million and a half per day with a shutin pressure of 1100 pounds. Gas is not being produced from this well at the present time. At the present time the Claude A. Aikman Well No. 1, Currie, as the only well producing high pressure gas in Section 7 and 18. As the well is at present not included in any gas roo' defined by the Oil Conservation Commission, the purchaser is taking was only on the lasis of 80 acres within a standard Governmental quarter section attributed to the Aikman well. It is for this reason that Mr. Aikman has filled his sentiertion for that serv shorthedex run promotion unit, so that

he may be bermitted to recover his just and equitable share of natural gas in the area now proposed to be included in the Sumont Gas.

Pool by extention thereof, to be considered during this hearing under Case No. 713 (f). He wish to express our endorsement of the proposed extension of the Sumont Gas Pool so far as it includes Section 7,

Township 21 South, Range 37 East and the Claude E. Aikman No. 1

well Currie, as it is our opinion that the gas reservoir as developed in the Aikman Well probably belongs in the Sumont Gas Pool.

In support of this opinion, we wish to call attention to the fact that the Eumont Gas Pool was created by Oil Conservation Commission Order No. R-264, dated February 17, 1953 in Case 245. This order provided that the producing formation in the Eumont Gas Pool shall extend from the top of the Yates formation to a point 200 feet below the top of the Queen formation, thereby including all of the Seven Rivers formation. Fy Oil Conservation Commission order 264-4 dated October 17, 1953 in Cases Mos. 245 and 521, it was held that the vertical productive limits of the Eumont Gas Pool as fixed by Order Mo. 246 should be changed to include all the Queen formation. The producing formations of the Eumont Gas Pool therefore now include all of the Yates, Seven Rivers, and Queen formations.

I have here what is marked Exhibit No. 2 in Case No. 701, being a West-Cast cross section showing wells in Section 11, Township 21 South, Range 36 East, now within the Ermont Pool to and including Section 7, Township 21 south, Range 37 east.

Skhibit No. 3 is a well map of the area on which is indice ad and north south the line of the Nest-Inst/cross section shown on Exhibit No. 2.

Peferring to Skhibis No. 2, the three westermost wells are the least-mental No. 1, State D-11 in the northwest quarter, southwest

marter of Section 11, the Two States Lett northwest, southerst Section 12 and the Market demonstry Mall Co. 1 Riddell in the southerst enveter, southwest emerter of Rection 12. all in Township 21 South, Range 36 cart. These three wells are on a gas proration schedule for April 1954 under the Mumont Gas Pool. You will note from Exhibit 2 that the producing interval from these three wells includes the Queen sand. The Chaude J. Allman No. 1 Currie shown on the right-hand side of Exhibit 2 likewise produces high pressure gas from the same Queen sand formation. It is our opinion, therefore, that the Eumont Gas Pool should be extended to include the Aikman well. It is further stated that the Aikman Well No. 1 Currie was completed and on production prior to January 1. 1954, the effective date for proration of gas in the previously defined Eumont Gas Pool under Order R-370-A dated November 10, 1953 in Case No. 584, and that the Aikman well is within the limits of the pool as proposed for extension of the Eumont Pool under Case No. 713.

The applicant's Curric lease embraces the south half, northeast quarter and the north half, southeast quarter, Section 7, Township 215, Range 37 east. It is impractical to pool applicant's lease with the adjoining acreage within the east half of Section 7. The owners of the adjoining acreage in said section have not objected to the formation of the proposed unorthodox gas promation unit covering this 160 acre lease. I preach herewith as Exhibit Four, a letter dated April 1, 1954 written by Mr. William H. Aikman to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission requesting that Claude Librar be granted a hearing on May 19, 1954 for the formation of the unorthodox gas promation unit, the sold unit being the subject of this Care 701.

Rodman, Amerada, Heville G. Penrose, Tro., Tide I for / processed Osl. Company, and Continental Oil Company. The parties named are holders of working interest in oil and gas leases in Section 7 and of offset acreage to the east in Section 8. No objections to the gas promation unit requested by Mr. Aikman have been received from these parties.

Mr. Rodman has orally expressed his opinion that he offers no objection to the request in this case.

Further, I wish to present as Exhibit 5 a letter dated May 13, 1954 addressed to Mr. Claude Aikman from Mr. John P. McNaughton which states that, "This will advise that Meville G. Penrose Inc. has no objection to the formation of an unorthodox gas unit comprising the south half, northeast quarter and north half, southeast quarter of Section 7, Township 21 south, Range 37 east, Lea County, New Mexico." Neville G. Penrose Inc. owns the shallow operating rights through the Queen formation including the south half of the southeast quarter of Section 7.

We wish to state further that unless a proration unit embracing the south half of the northeast quarter, and north half of the southeast quarter of Section 7 is permitted, Mr. Aikman will be deprived of an opportunity to recover his just and equitable share of the natural gas from the gas reservoir of the Eumont Gas Pool, and that the creation of the gas proration unit consisting of this acreage will prevent waste and protect correlative rights, and is necessary to prevent confiscation of applicant's property.

It is further requested that the provision unit created in respect to this application be granted effective January 1, 1954 so that the allowable thereunder may be effective from that date the same as any standard or orthodox provision unit for said Eumont Cas

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 o'clock a. m., on May 19, 1954, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this 7 day of Jeels, 1954, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the records and testimony adduced, and being fully advised in the premises;

FINDS:

- (1) That due notice of the time and place of hearing and the purpose thereof having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this case and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That pursuant to provisions of Rule 7 (a) of Order No. R-370-A, the Commission has power and authority to permit the formation of a gas proration unit consisting of other than a legal quarter section after notice and hearing by the Commission.
- (3) That applicant, Claude E. Aikman, is the owner of an oil and gas lease in 'ea County, New Mexico the land consisting of other than a legal quarter section, and described as follows, to-wit:

TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM. S/2 NE/4 and N/2 SE/4 of Section 7

containing 160 acres, more or less.

(4) That applicant, Claude E. Aikman has a producing well on the aforesaid lease known as No. 1, Currie, located 1980' from the South line and 660' from the East line of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 37 East.

- (5) That the aforesaid well is located within the limits of the pool heretofore delineated and designated as the Eumont Gas Pool.
- (6) That it is impractical to pool applicant's said lease with adjoining acreage in the East half of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, NMPM., and that the owners of adjoining acreage in said half section have not objected to the formation of the proposed proration unit of 160 acres.
- (7) That unless a proration unit consisting of applicant's aforesaid acreage is permitted, applicant will be deprived of the opportunity to recover his just and equitable share of the natural gas in the Eumont Gas Pool.
- (8) That creation of a proration unit consisting of the aforesaid acreage will not cause but will prevent waste, will protect correlative rights, and is necessary to prevent confiscation of applicant's property.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That the application of Claude E. Aikman for approval of an unorthodox proration unit consisting of the following described acreage

TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 37 EAST, NMPM. S/2 NE/4 and N/2 SE/4 of Section 7

be and the same is hereby approved, and a proration unit consisting of aforesaid acreage is hereby created.

(2) That applicant's well, No. 1 Currie, located in the NE/4 SE/4 of Section 7, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, shall be granted an allowable from January 1, 1954 in the proportion that the above described 160 acre unit bears to the standard or orthodox proration unit for said pool, all until further order of the Commission.
