SPECIAL ORDER AUTHORIZINGED REPORT SHOWING THE CURRENT STATUS OF WELLS IN THE VARIOUS DISTRICTS AND FIELDS IN THE STATE OF TEXAS

WHEREAS, After due notice a hearing was held by the Railroad Commission of Texas on February 24, 1941, for the purpose of determining whether or not weste (as defined in the statutes of this state) of crude oil or natural gas is taking place in this state or is reasonably imminent; and what if any rule, regulation or order should be established to correct, prevent or lessen waste; and

WHEREAS, From evidence adduced at seid hearing, it appears to the commission that a general well status survey of all the wells in the State of Texas would further the conservation of crude oil and natural gas and could be used as the basis for the establishment of fair and equitable allowables;

THEREFORE IT IS CRDERED By the Railroad Commission of Texas that every operator of oil wells in the fields and districts in Texas shall furnish, upon request by the commission, a detailed report setting forth on a form supplied by the commission, a copy of which is attached hereto end hereby made a part of this order, the following information:

District, field and county, name and address of operator, name of lease, well number, the top of sand or producing horizon and the total depth of each well, the status of each well as to whether it is flowing, pumping, on air or gas lift, or dead, the current schedule allowable, the production of oil and water during the test, the per cent of water, together with a statement as to whether or not the well is currently making its allowable.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the date on the production of each well as required above shall be obtained by actual individual well tests made in accordance with the provisions given below:

All wells shall be produced during the test under the same operating conditions as exist when producing the current daily allowable from the well. No change may be made in the operating conditions during the 24-hour period preceding the test, nor during the duration of the test.

Each operator shall keep on file for a period of six (6) months after the well status report is filed, a complete record of all data observed while conducting the test required by the well status report. These data shall include the following information:

The time and date the test was started and the time and date the test was completed; the location and number of the tenks in which the well was tested; the opening and closing tenk gages and at least two gages taken during the test period; if the well is flowing, the size of the choke, tubing and casing pressure; if the well is pumping, the size of the working barrel, the length of stroke, the number of strokes per minute; if the well is on gas lift, the injection pressure and the amount of injection gas used during the test period. If the wells are not produced continuously, the tanks must be gaged each time the wells are shut in.

If possible the water production for wells producing water shall be determined by volumetric measurement in the separate tank into which the well is being produced. However, if it is impracticable to measure the water in this manner, then the water percentage may be determined either by measuring the water with a weir or positive displacement meter. In lieu of the above methods, when specifically permitted by the commission, the water per cent may be determined by frequent shakeouts of samples collected at the wellhead.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the well status reports be mailed direct to the Engineering Department of the Rollroad Commission of Texas, at Austin, Texas, by the person making such report.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That this cause be held open on the docket for such other and further orders as in the opinion of the commission may be necessary and supported by evidence of record.







A separate certificate shall be filed for each transporter authorized to transport oil from a unit. After said certificate has been approved by the Oil Conservation Commission, one copy shall be forwarded to the transporter, one copy returned to the producer, and two copies retained by the Oil Conservation Commission.

A new certificate shall be filed to cover each change in operating ownership and each change in the transporter, except that in the case of a temporary change in the transporter involving less than the allowable production for one month the operator shall, in lieu of filing a new certificate, notify the Oil Conservation Commission at Santa Fe, New Mexico, and the transporter authorized by certificate on file with the Commission, by letter of the estimated amount of oil to be moved by the transporter temporarily moving oil from the unit and the name of such temporary transporter and a copy of such notice shall also be furnished such temporary transporter. Such temporary transporter shall not move any more oil than the estimated amount shown in said notice.

This certificate when properly executed and approved by the Oil Conservation Commission shall constitute a permit for pipe line connection and authorization to transport oil from the property named therein and shall remain in full force and effect until

- (a) Operating ownership changes
- (b) The transporter is changed or
 - (c) The permit is cancelled by the Commission

If any of the rules and regulations of the oil Conservation Commission have not been complied with at the time this report is filed, explain fully under the heading "REMARKS."

The addresses of the producer, as required on this report, shall be clear and definite as to Street Number, City, State and Mailing Address. In space "Kind of Lesse" show whether State Land, Covernment Land or Patented Land. On state land leases also show state land Number and assignment number. On government land also show the name of the Permittee or Lessee.

This report shall be made monthly by each producer of crude petroleum oil. An executed copy shall be filed on or before the 15th day of each month with each of the following: Oil Conservation Commission at Santa Fe; Lea County Proration Office at Hobbs; and the pipe line company or other transporter moving oil from a well or wells or lease tank or any other receptacle. The report shall be complete as to data covering the calendar month next preceding the date of filing.

Report on this form, the required information relative to, the production of all crude petroleum oil and other hydrocarbons which are produced at the well head in liquid form by ordinary production methods. Show separately on this report, the required information relative to, products produced from a gas well or gas wells.

Make a separate report for each lease.

Where a lease is comprised of two or more units, list each unit separately reporting the production, the scheduled allowable, and the amount overproduced or underproduced by units as designated on proration schedule and the total production and allowable of all units. When two or more units are produced into a central tank battery the amount of oil produced from each unit may be estimated. The oil on hand at beginning of month, the disposition of oil, the oil on hand at the end of the month, and total capacity of lease tanks may be reported by leases.

All amounts of oil shall be reported in barrels computed from 100% tank tables and based upon actual physical gauges.

THE PETITION OF THE NEW MEXTCO OIL AND GAS ASSOCIATION TO CONSIDER REVISION IN ITS EXISTING RULES AND REGULATIONS REQUIRING REPORTS TO BE FILED BY PRODUCERS, TRANSPORTERS, STORERS, AND REFINERS OF CRUDE PETROLEUM CIL AND NATURAL GAS AND THE PRODUCTS THEREOF.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at two o'clock P.M., September 25, 1941, at Santa Fe, New Mexico.

NOW, on this <u>3rd</u> day of <u>November</u>, 1941 the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission", having before it for consideration the testimony adduced at the hearing of said case and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds:

- A. That notice by publication of the filing of the application herein, the time and the place of the hearing thereon, and the purpose of said hearing, have been regularly given in all respects as required by law, and the Commission has jurisdiction of the subject matter embraced in seid petition and of the parties interested therein, and jurisdiction to issue and promulgate the hereinafter prescribed order.
- B. That the general rules and regulations herein below set out in the Order are found to be reasonably necessary to prevent present and imminent waste to oil and gas as defined by law and otherwise to carry out the purposes of Chapter 72, Session Laws of 1935 and Acts amendatory thereof.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the following rules and regulations amending Order No. 4 and Order No. 52 of the Commission be and are hereby adopted and promulgated to become effective as of 7 A.M., November 1, 1941:

SECTION I

The provisions of this order shall extend and apply to all crude petroleum oil or natural gas, or both, produced from each and every well within the State of New Mexico, and all crude petroleum oil or natural gas transported, stored, refined, processed or otherwise handled within the State of New Mexico and to every producer, transporter, storer, refiner, processor and handler in the State of New Mexico.

SECTION II

Rule 21 (Written Notices, Requests and Reports) as provided in Order No. 4 shall be cancelled in its entirety and the following shall be the context of Rule 21 of General Rules and Regulations Governing the Conservation of Oil and Gas in New Mexico:

RULE 21. WRITTEN NOTICES, REQUESTS AND REPORTS.

The following forms shall be used in giving notices and making requests and reports to the Commission:

Form C-101. Notice of Intention to Drill.

Form C-102. Miscellaneous Notices.

Form C-103. Miscellaneous Reports on Wells.

Form C-105. Well Record.

Form C-108. Producer's Monthly Crude Petroleum Cil Report.

Form C-109. Operator's Monthly Report of Operations.

Form C-110. Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil.

Form C-111. Monthly Gas Report.

Form C-112. Transporter's and Storer's Monthly Report.

Form C-113. Refiner's Monthly Report.

Form C-114. Gasoline or other Extraction Plant Monthly Report.

SECTION III

(a) Rule 34, Operator's Monthly Report on Operations, as provided in Order No. 4 shall be cancelled in its entirety and that portion of Order No. 52, Special Rules and Regulations for Lea County Fields, New Mexico, requiring Operator's Monthly Report of Operations in Lea County Fields, Form C-104-A or C-104, and the following shall be the context of Rule 34 of General Rules and Regulations Governing the Conservation of Oil and Gas in New Mexico:

RULE 34. PRODUCER'S MONTHLY CRUDE PETROLEUM OIL REPORT. (FORM C-108)

Mexico, and each producer of liquid hydrocarbons from a gas well, where produced in liquid form at the well head by ordinary production methods, shall furnish for each calendar month a Producer's Monthly Crude Petroleum Oil Report, Form C-108, setting forth complete information and data indicated by such forms respecting crude petroleum oil produced from every proration or operating unit operated by said producer in the State of New Mexico, and respecting liquid hydrocarbons produced from gas wells at the well head in liquid form by ordinary production methods from each proration or operating unit operated by said producer in the State of New Mexico. Such report for each month shall be prepared and filed according to instructions, on or before the 15th day of the next succeeding month.

(b) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Producer's Monthly Crude Petroleum Oil Report", Form C-108, and instructions for said report annexed hereto are hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION IV

RULE 34-A. OPERATOR'S MONTHLY REPORT OF OPERATIONS. (FORM C-109)

Each producer or operator of oil and/or gas wells within the State of New Mexico shall furnish for each calendar month an Operator's Monthly Report of Operations, Form C-109, setting forth complete information and data indicated on said form

respecting crude petroleum oil and natural gas from each proration or operating unit operated by said producer in the State of New Mexico. Such report for each month shall be prepared and filed according to instructions on or before the 25th day of the next succeeding month.

All conflicting rules and regulations in force prior to the effective date of this Order are hereby superseded.

(b) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Operator's Monthly Report of Operations", Form C-109, and instructions for said report annexed hereto are hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION V

(a) Rule 35, Request for Permission to Connect with Pipe Line (Form C-106) as provided in Order No. 4 shall be cancelled in its entirety and the following shall be the context of Rule 35 of General Rules and Regulations Governing the Conservation of Oil and Gas in New Mexico:

RULE 35. CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE AND AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSPORT OIL.

(FORM C-110)

Each producer of crude petroleum oil and each producer of liquid hydrocarbons from a gas well, where produced in liquid form at the well head by ordinary production methods in the State of New Mexico, shall execute under oath, in quadruplicate, and file with the Oil Conservation Commission, Santa Fe, New Mexico, a Producer's Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil, Form C-110, setting forth fully therein the data and information indicated by such form covering each proration or operating unit in the State of New Mexico from which the crude petroleum oil or liquid hydrocarbons is produced.

After the effective date hereof, whenever there shall occur a change in operating ownership of any proration or operating unit in the State of New Mexico, or whenever there shall occur a change of transporter from any proration or operating unit within the State of New Mexico, a new Producer's Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil, Form C-110, shall be executed

and filed in accordance with the instructions appearing on such forms; except that in the case of a temporary change in transporter involving less than the allowable for one month, the producer may, in lieu of filing a new certificate, notify the Oil Conservation Commission, Santa Fe, New Mexico, and the transporter then authorized by certificate on file with the Oil Conservation Commission, by letter, of the estimated amount of crude petroleum oil to be moved by temporary transporter and the name of such temporary transporter, and a copy of such notice shall also be furnished such temporary transporter. In no instance shall the temporary transporter move any greater quantity of crude petroleum oil than the estimated amount shown in said notice.

The Producer's Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil, Form C-110, when properly executed and approved by the Oil Conservation Commission, shall constitute authorization to the pipe line or other carrier to transport crude petroleum oil from the proration or operating unit named therein, and shall remain in force and effect until:

- (1) The operating ownership of the proration or operating unit changes, or
- (2) The transporter is changed, or
- (3) The permit is cancelled by the Oil Conservation Commission.

Each producer is prohibited from delivering illegal crude petroleum oil to any transporter, and each transporter is prohibited from removing any illegal crude petroleum oil from producer's lease tanks.

- (b) Within thirty (30) days after the adoption of this Order, each producer of crude petroleum oil in the State of New Mexico shall file in quadruplicate, with the Cil Conservation Commission at Santa Fe, New Mexico, Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil, Form C-110, covering each provation or operating unit under the control or operated by each producer in the State of New Mexico.
- (c) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Oil", Form C-110, is hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION VI

(a) Rule 36, Purchaser's Monthly Report, Form C-107, as provided in Order No. 4 Shall be cancelled in its entirety and the following shall be the context of Rule 36, new Rule 36A, new Rule 36B, and new Rule 36C of General Rules and Regulations Governing the Conservation of Oil and Gas in New Mexico:

RULE 36. MONTHLY GAS REPORT (FORM C-111)

All gas produced from oil wells and from gas wells within the State of New Mexico which is taken into a fuel system of other system (except gas taken into a gasoline or other extraction plant gathering system which is required to be reported on Gasoline or Other Extraction Plant Monthly Report, Form C-114, under the provisions of Rule 36-C) shall be reported monthly on said Monthly Gas Report, Form C-111. Where such gas is taken from an oil or gas well by the producer, then the producer shall make such report. In case the gas is taken at the well by any person other than the producer then such person taking the gas shall make said report. The person or producer thus required to make this report shall execute and file in the manner hereinafter directed a Monthly Gas Report, Form C-111, in accordance with instruction on the form on or before the 15th day of the next succeeding month.

(b) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Monthly Gas Report", Form C-111, is hereby adopted and made a part or this Order.

SECTION VII

RULE 36-A. TRANSPORTER'S AND STORER'S MONTHLY REPORT. (FORM C-112)

(a) Each transporter of crude petroleum oil within the State of New Mexico shall furnish for each calendar month a Transporter's and Storer's Monthly Report, Form C-112, containing complete information and data indicated by such form respecting stocks of crude petroleum oil on hand and all movements of crude petroleum oil by pipe line within the State of New Mexico and all movements of crude petroleum oil by trucks or other

conveyances including railroads, from leases to storers or refiners; between transporters within the State; between storers within the State; between refiners within the State; and between storers and refiners within the State.

- (b) Each storer of crude petroleum oil within the State of New Mexico shall furnish for each calendar month a Transporter's and Storer's Monthly Report, Form C-112, containing complete information and data indicated by such form respecting the storage of crude petroleum oil within the State of New Mexico.
- (c) The transporters and storers reports for each month shall be prepared and filed in accordance with instructions on the form on or before the 15th day of the next succeeding month.
- (d) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Transporter's and Storer's Monthly Report", Form C-112, is hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION VIII

RULE 36-B. REFINER'S MONTHLY REPORT. (FORM C-113)

Every refiner of crude petroleum oil within the State of New Mexico shall furnish for each calendar month a Refiner's Monthly Report, Form C-113, containing the information and data indicated by such form respecting crude petroleum oil and products involved in such refiner's operations during each month. Such report for each month shall be prepared and filed according to instructions on the form, on or before the 15th day of the next succeeding month.

(b) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Refiner's Monthly Report", Form C-113, is hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION IX

RULE 36-C. GASOLINE OR OTHER EXTRACTION PLANT MONTHLY REPORT (FORM C-114)

Each operator of a gasoline plant, cycling plant or any other plant at which gasoline, butane, propane, condensate, kerosene, oil, or other liquid products are extracted from

natural gas within the State of New Mexico, shall furnish for each calendar month a Gasoline or Other Extraction Plant Monthly Report, Form C-114, containing the information indicated by such form respecting natural gas and products involved in the operation of each such plant during each month. Such report for each month shall be prepared and filed according to instructions on the form, on or before the 15th day of the next succeeding month.

(b) The form of report annexed hereto and designated "Gasoline or Other Extraction Plant Monthly Report", Form C-114, is hereby adopted and made a part of this Order.

SECTION X

All quantities of crude petroleum oil and products included in the reports provided for in this Order shall be reported in barrels of 42 United States gallons, computed from 100% tank tables and based upon actual physical gauges.

All volumes of gas shall be reported in M.C.F. at 14.4 pounds plus 10 oz. pressure.

SECTION XI

All producers, transporters, storers, refiners, gasoline or extraction plant operators and initial takers of natural gas within the State of New Mexico shall make and keep appropriate books and records covering their operations in New Mexico from which they may be able to make and substantiate the reports required by this Order.

SECTION XII

This Order shall not be taken or construed to limit or restrict the authority of the Oil Conservation Commission to require the furnishing of such additional reports, data or other information relative to production, transportation, storing, refining, processing or handling of crude petroleum oil, natural gas or products in the State of New Mexico as may appear to it to be necessary or desirable, either generally or specially.

BY MR. LIVINGSTON: The Commission is now ready to proceed upon case No. 30. If anyone has any witness to be sworn, bring forward the witness.

GUY L. TATE,

being presented as a witness before the Commission, and being first duly sworn, gave the following testimony:

DIRECT TESTIMONY

My name is G. L. Tate, Chairman of the New Mexico
Oil and Gas Committee appointed by the President, Mr. Dexter,
to draft a set of reporting forms and prepare a form of
procedure in keeping with the conservation laws of the State
of New Mexico. These forms were to be prepared, or drafted,
in conjunction with representatives of the New Mexico Oil
Conservation Commission, with representatives of Federal
Tender Board No. 1, a board created for the enforcement of
the Connelly Act, and to work with representatives of the

oil industry in general.

This Committee met in Santa We on July 24th and 25th, at which time a set of reporting forms were drafted. The Committee met again, here in Santa Fe, on September 24th and the morning of the 25th.

This Committee, in conjunction with the representatives above referred to, have drafted a set of reporting forms, which I propose to recommend to the Commission for adoption. The recommendation of these forms carries with it the recommendation that certain forms be eliminated.

Monthly Crude Petroleum Oil Report, which has a form number, N. M. 1, assigned to it merely for identification. This form is required to be made out monthly by each producer of an oil well in the State of New Mexico, covering the production for the current month of crude petroleum oil and other liquid hydrocarbon, produced at the well head by ordinary production methods.

I would lik, to submit this form as part of this evidence.

(Marked "Exhibit No. 1)

BY GOVERNOR MILES: May I ask a question? You said you would recommend that certain forms be eliminated. Is that certain forms now being used?

A Yes, sir.

BY GOVERNOR MILES: Is this one to be eliminated?

A No, that is the form to be adopted. I will explain one more form, and then recommend the form those two forms are to take the place of.

I have here oil Operators Monthly Report, which has a number, N.M. No. 7. This form has been prepared in conjunction with the Lea County Engineers Committee. The information to be reported is production by units, and other related data.

I would like to submit this form as part of this

evidence.

(Marked Exhibit No. 2)

It is recommended that these two forms, N. M.ml and N. M. 7, be adopted, and that the requirements of Forms C-104 and C-104A be repealed.

The Committee has prepared a Transporters' and Storers' Monthly Report, Form N.M. No. 2, consisting of sheet 1, 1-a, 1-b, 1-c, and sheet 2. This report is to be required of all transporters and storers of crude petroleum oil and other liquid hydrocarbons handled or stored within the State of New Mexico.

I would like to submit this form as part of this evidence.

(Marked Exhibit No. 3)

The Committee has prepared a Monthly Gas Report, Form N. M. No. 3. This report is required of all initial takers of gas at the well head, except the producer who is required to report the disposition of his own gas, which he utilizes either as lease fuel, gas lift, etc., on Form N. M. No. 7.

As part of this evidence I would like to submit this form.

(Marked Exhibit No. 4)

It is recommended that Forms N. M. 2 and N. M. 3 be adopted, and that rules and regulations requiring the filing of C-107 be repealed.

BY MR. KELLY: These two are purchasers! forms to take the place of our present purchasers forms?

A Yes, sir.

The Committee has prepared Refiners' Monthly Report, Form N. M. No. 4, consisting of sheets 1, 1-a, 1-b and sheet 2.

This form, N. M. No. 4, is submitted as part of this testimony.

(Marked Exhibit No. 5)

The Committee has prepared a Gasoline and other Extraction

Plant Monthly Report, Form N. M. No. 5. This report is to be made out -- or be filed by operators of any extraction plant within the State of New Mexico. This report consists of sheet 1 and sheet 2.

This form, N. I. No. 5, is submitted as part of this testimony.

(Marked Exhibit No. 6)

The Committee has prepared, and submits herewith, a form headed "Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Gil", Form No. M. R. Ro. 6, and is submitted as part of this testimony.

(Marked Exhibit No. 7)

It is recommended that the Commission adopt Forms N. H. No. 5 and N. L. No. 6.

Each of these forms, except Form N. M. No. 7, has printed on the reverse side thereof instructions relative to the preparation and filing of the same.

It is further recommended that the Commission repeal the rules and regulations requiring the filing of C-106.

It is further recommended, for the purpose of conserving paper, therefore limiting the expenditure in the printing of these forms, that Forms N. M. No. 1, N. M. No. 2, N. M. No. 3, N. M. No. 4 and N. M. No. 5 be printed on legal size paper, $8\frac{1}{2}$ xl4 inches, with the form running with the cut of the paper.

BY MR. KENLER:

- Q Mr. Tate, you introduced yourself by saying you were the Chairman of a Committee that has been appointed to redesign forms now being used by the State of New Mexico. Would you mind giving the names of the other members of the Committee?
- A I would be very glad to, sir. I have stated the name of the association in the beginning. The Committee, of which I am Chairman, was appointed by Mr. Dexter, President of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association. The Committee consists of Mr. Glenn Staley, Mr. Van Welch, Mr. J. W. Emerson, Mr.

A. D. Wilbur and me. According to the minutes of the meeting in Santa Fe on July 24th and 25th, this Committee was in agreement with these forms.

- Q One hundred per cent?
- A According to the forms that were prepared and submitted, I assume one hundred per cent. They agreed on the forms, together with Mr. Kelly, who was in the meeting, and Mr. Livingston --
- BY MR. KELLY: We were in the meeting as observers, Mr. Livingston and I, therefore I don't believe we should be included in any agreement, as it is the Commission's duty to accept the forms.
- Livingston, of the Oil Conservation Commission, sat in at these hearings and made suggestions and suggested changes in the tentative draft of the forms, and assisted in every way possible in order to cooperate and expedite the preparation of such forms. At these hearings on the 24th and 25th, it was the consensus of the opinion, according to the minutes, that in addition to Forms Nos. 105 and 106, inclusive, that there was a need for an engineering or an operating report.

 Mr. Staley agreed to prepare such a report. This report was submitted here as being one prepared by that engineering committee and put in evidence a few minutes ago.
- Q Thank you very much. I wondered whether or not the officers of the organization which your committee represents, concurred in these recommendations.
- BY GOVERNOR MILES: You gave certain names of men who are members of the committee of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association.

 I would like to ask Mr. Leonard, of that Association, to state, if he has the information, what percentage of the oil producers and operators in New Mexico belong to that association.

BY MR. LEONARD: I could not tell you offhand.

MY MR. KELLY: Would it be a majority of the oil producers?

BY MR. LECHARD: Oh, yes.

BY MR. TATE: There has been a request by Mr. Kenler that an

officer of the association state whether or not they concur in these recommendations. Could you state that?

BY MR. LECNARD: I am not familiar with them. I would have to study them.

BY LR. TATE: Could you speak for the Association?

BY MR. LEONARD: I am just the Secretary. Your Committee was appointed by the President to draft the forms.

BY MR. TATE: Mr. Leonard, are there any other officers of the Association here?

BY MR. LEONARD: I don't know.

BY MR. TATE: I don't know them personally, and if they are here,
I would like to call on them.

BY MR. LEONARD: Mr. Griffith is present.

BY MR. GRIFFITH: I have no statement to make with respect to the forms. I am not familiar with them.

BY MR. KELLY: Any further questions to be put to the witness?

BY MR. GAIL CARTER: Do any of the proposed changes have anything to do with the reports made to the Tax Commission or the Bureau of Revenue?

BY MR. TATE: They do not, sir.

Witness dismissed.

BY MR. SETH: I rather want to make a suggestion. Mr. Gray showed me one report, on C-104A, one in which there were 108 sheets on one monthly report, each one signed and sworn to by the officers of the company. These regulations should expressly authorize one affidavit, or certificate covering a report. It seems this is overworking the men who sign them and the notary public. One affidavit ought to cover one report.

With reference to the question asked Mr. Leonard, I am certain the committee was appointed merely to make recommendations to the Commission. We all know the Commission is familiar with local conditions and familiar with what it needs to enable it to function, and it will take these forms

and work out a report satisfactory to all concerned, and will certainly not impose any unnecessary report making on the producers, the refiners and the oil industry.

BY AR. TATE: Mr. Dan Parker, of Federal Tender Board No. 1, is here, and I would like to ask Mr. Parker as to his views on these forms, as to whether or not they are practical, or any other suggestion he might have.

BY MR. KELLY: We would be glad to hear from Mr. Parker.

BY MR. PARKER: The Federal Tender Board requires certain information from the operators in three states, including New Mexico, and this information is required on four separate report forms. Four of the forms just recommended by this committee are identical with forms now being required by the Federal Tender Board. Of course, in addition to the information the Federal Tender Board needs, the state needs certain engineering date, and that is covered by the other three forms recommended by the committee.

I have worked with the committee in drafting these forms, and I know it has been a lot of hard work. We feel they are practical and will give the desired information, and the Federal Tender Board is glad to join with the Committee in recommending they be adopted.

BY MR. KELLY: Would you mind answering one question. In New Mexico we operate on a unit basis. Will it be acceptable to the Federal Tender Board for these to be made on a unit basis if the leases are totaled on the forms?

BY MR. PARKER: Yes, sir.

BY MR. KELLY: Do you wish the leases to be totaled on the forms?

BY MR. PARKER: Yes, our reports are set up on a lease basis. If they are not totaled, when we copy them we would have to total them.

BE IR. RELLY: It will be acceptable for all reports from New Mexico to be on a unit bask with the lease total on them.

All my company is interested is is that the Commission and all authorities concerned fully understand there will be a discrepancy between the amount of gas shown on our official records in the Tulsa office and the amount of gas reported to the State of New Mexico and to Federal Tender Board No. 1, in that the gas volumes reported to the State of New Mexico and to Rederal Tender Board No. 1 will run something between ten and fifteen per cent lower than our office records will show, by a purchaser. We can easily convert the figures in our office from 1322 plus four to 14.4 plus ten ounces -- it will impose no additional hardship in making the reports, but we want all authorities to understand, in case an audit is made, that our records will show a larger amount than we have shown on the reports because of the difference of the pressure basis on which we purchase gas by contract and the pressure basis on which we report.

- BY MR. KELLY: If we accept the basis of 14.4 plus ten ounces, the gas volumes reported to the Commission will be smaller in amount than that shown in your office, because of the fact that your basis, on contracts, is 13.2 plus four ounces. That statement is made in the record, so there will be no confusion in the pay-off.
- Board No. 1 and received instructions which will prevent a misunderstanding between our company and the Federal Tender Board.
- BY MR. TATE: Mr. Kelly, your question to Mr. Parker has prompted me to make a further explanation of two forms. N. M. No. 1, as prepared and submitted, is to be on a lease basis. N. M. No. 7 is to be on a unit basis

- BY MR. KELLY: N. M. No. 1 is the form which conforms to the requirements of the Federal Tender Board?
- BY MR. TATE: On a lease basis. As a matter of cooperation, they would accept this on a unit basis if the lease totals were shown. That N. M. No. I was changed this morning in the committee meeting to be submitted on a lease basis, which would conform exactly with the Federal Government requirements, and then we prepared another form, N. M. No. 7, to be submitted on a unit basis. The Federal Government will not get this type of report, because it has the information needed, but the Commission will need that in the allocation of oil in the respective units. Proration in New Mexico is on a unit basis, and the Federal Government should be able to check on a unit basis.
- BY MR. KELLY: Any other explanation of any of those forms?
- BY MR. TATE: Just one, I believe. The monthly gas form is a purchase gas form. The way it will work, in most instances -- it will be noted that a purchaser is any person taking gas if he has to cross a lease line with the gas?
- BY MR. KELLY: That is right.
- BY MR. TATE: I would still like to make another statement. It will be noted in the forms submitted there has been some changes to make them conform with the changes and reports in the instructions and on the face of the form. That is true with reference to N. M. No. 1 and N. M. No. 3, I believe. Those are the only ones.
- BY MR. BULLOCK: The statement made by Mr. Mann a few minutes ago on this pressure basis, is that to be for all gasdline plants that do due to the fact that gasoline plants are on a 13.2 pressure basis, or rather gasoline or dry gas, that would be the pressure base in New Mexico?
- BY MR. KELLY: Oh, I believe Mr. Mann's statement was not only for his company, but for all plants on the same basis.
- B M. TATE: Where volumes are to be reported in any of those forms, the instructions require it be reported on a 14.4 plus

ten ounce basis.

BY MR. KELLY: Any further comments?

If there are no further comments, the Commission will take the forms under advisement.
