Dear Sir:

At a meeting held in Hobbs on October 20, 1948, the New Mexico Nomenclature Committee voted to make the following recommendations to the Oil Conservation Commission:

1. Extend the Blinebry Pool to include the  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 25,  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 26,  $E\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 35, all of Section 36, Township 21 South, Range 37 East. All of Section 1,  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 12, Township 22 South, Range 37 East;  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 7, Township 22 South, Range 38 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County. This extension was made necessary with the completion of the Repollo Oil Company-Hill #1, located in the  $SE\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 26-21S-37E, as a producing oil well through casing perforations 5660' to 5720' in the Blinebry zone of the Yeso formation.
2. Extend the Pearsall Pool to include the  $S\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 27-17S-32E, N.M.P.M., Lea County. This extension was made necessary with the completion as a producing oil well of the Kewanee Oil Company-Baish B #35, located in the  $NW\frac{1}{4}SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 27. The well is producing from the Artesia Red Sand of the Queen formation, which is the producing zone of the Pearsall Pool.
3. Extend the Watkins Pool to include the  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 31-18S-32E, N.M.P.M., Lea County. This extension is necessary because of the completion as a producing oil well of the Kelley Stout-Stout #1, located in the  $SE\frac{1}{4}NW\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 31. This new well is producing from a sand topped at 3009' in the upper part of the Seven Rivers formation. The regular producing formation of the Watkins Pool is defined as being the Seven Rivers formation, although the productive sand occurs stratigraphically below the productive sand in the Stout well. In the opinion of the Committee, however, there was not enough difference in the two zones to warrant the creation of a new pool at this time.
4. Create a new pool to be designated as the South Drinkard Pool and to embrace all of the following described acreage: All of Section 3, Township 23 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County. The discovery well of this new pool is the Skelly Oil Company R. R. Sims #7, located in the  $NE\frac{1}{4}SW\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 3. This well was completed as a producing oil well through casing perforations from 6420' to 6490' in the Drinkard zone of the Yeso formation. The well is located approximately  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles southwest of the nearest production in the Drinkard Pool and, therefore, it was believed advisable to create a new pool.

5. Delete from the Cooper-Jal Pool all of Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 36 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County. There are two gas wells in this section, which do not, in the opinion of the Committee, belong in the Cooper-Jal Pool.
6. Delete from the Penrose Skelly Pool the  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 6, all of Section 7, all of Section 18,  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County. This deleted area contains several gas wells which, in the opinion of the Committee, do not belong in the Penrose-Skelly Pool.
7. Extend the Langlie-Mattix Pool to include all of Sections 1, 2, 11, 12, 13, and 14,  $E\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 23,  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 24, Township 23 South, Range 36 East,  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 6, all of Sections 7 and 18,  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of Section 19, Township 23 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County. This would include in the Langlie-Mattix Pool those gas wells deleted from the Cooper-Jal and the Penrose Skelly Pools and also a number of gas wells which heretofore did not fall into any defined pool.

ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter came on regularly for hearing at 10:00 A.M., on January 6, 1949, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

NOW, on this 27th day of January, 1949, the Commission having before it for consideration the recommendation of the Nomenclature Committee and the testimony adduced at the hearing of said cause, and being fully advised in the premises;

FINDS:

1. That due public notice having been given pursuant to law, jurisdiction is vested in the Commission;
2. That the recommendation of the Nomenclature Committee for deletion of said described land from the Cooper-Jal pool, is acceptable;
3. That the only production upon the land sought to be deleted is a gas well;
4. That exceptions to the requirements of Section 6 of Order 633 as from time to time supplemented should be granted in proper cases.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the recommendation of the Nomenclature Committee that all of Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 36 East, N.M.P.M. be eliminated and deleted from the Cooper-Jal pool as heretofore defined, be and it hereby is accepted and approved and said Section 14, Township 23 South, Range 36 East, N.M.P.M. is hereby deleted therefrom.
