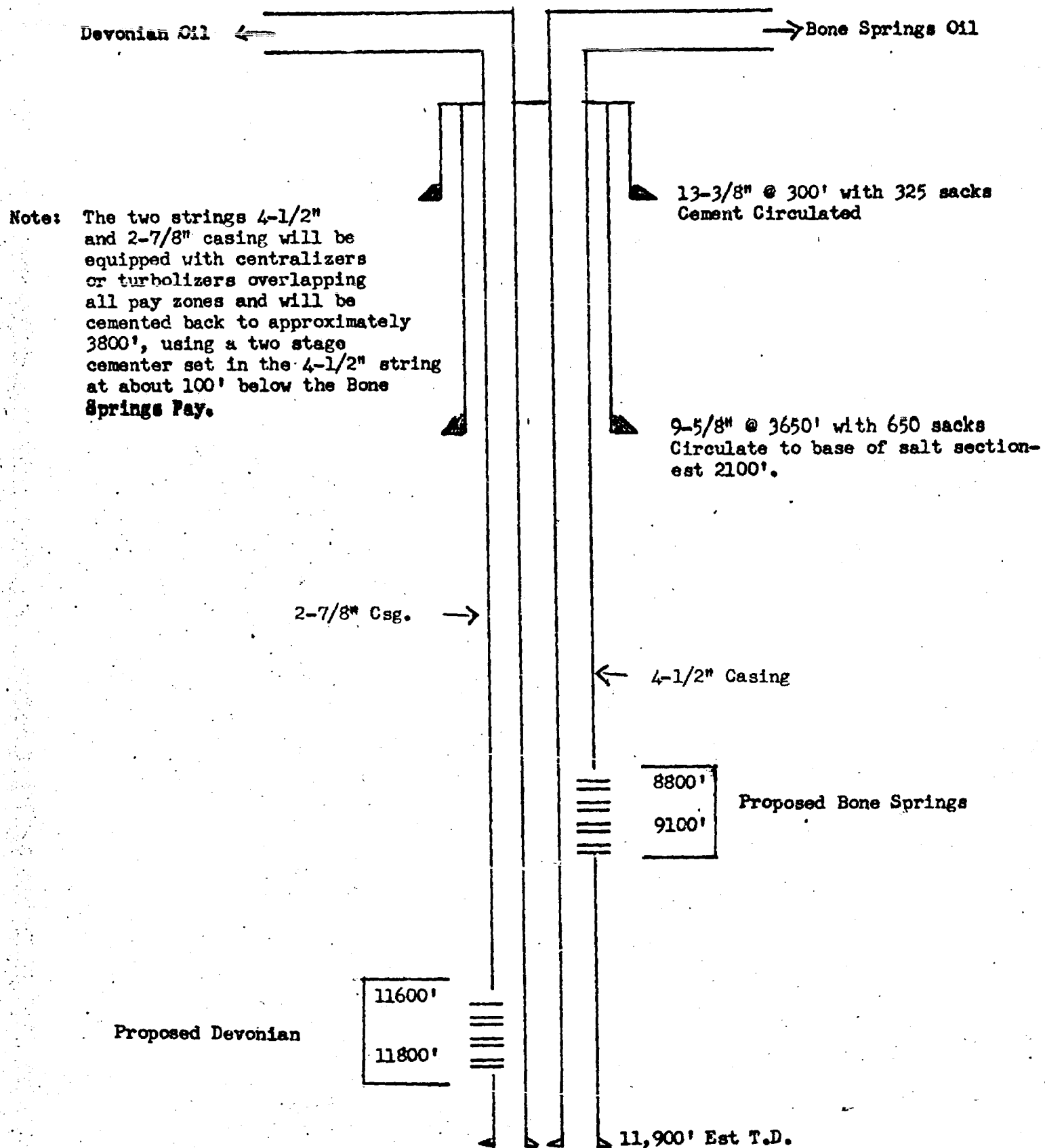

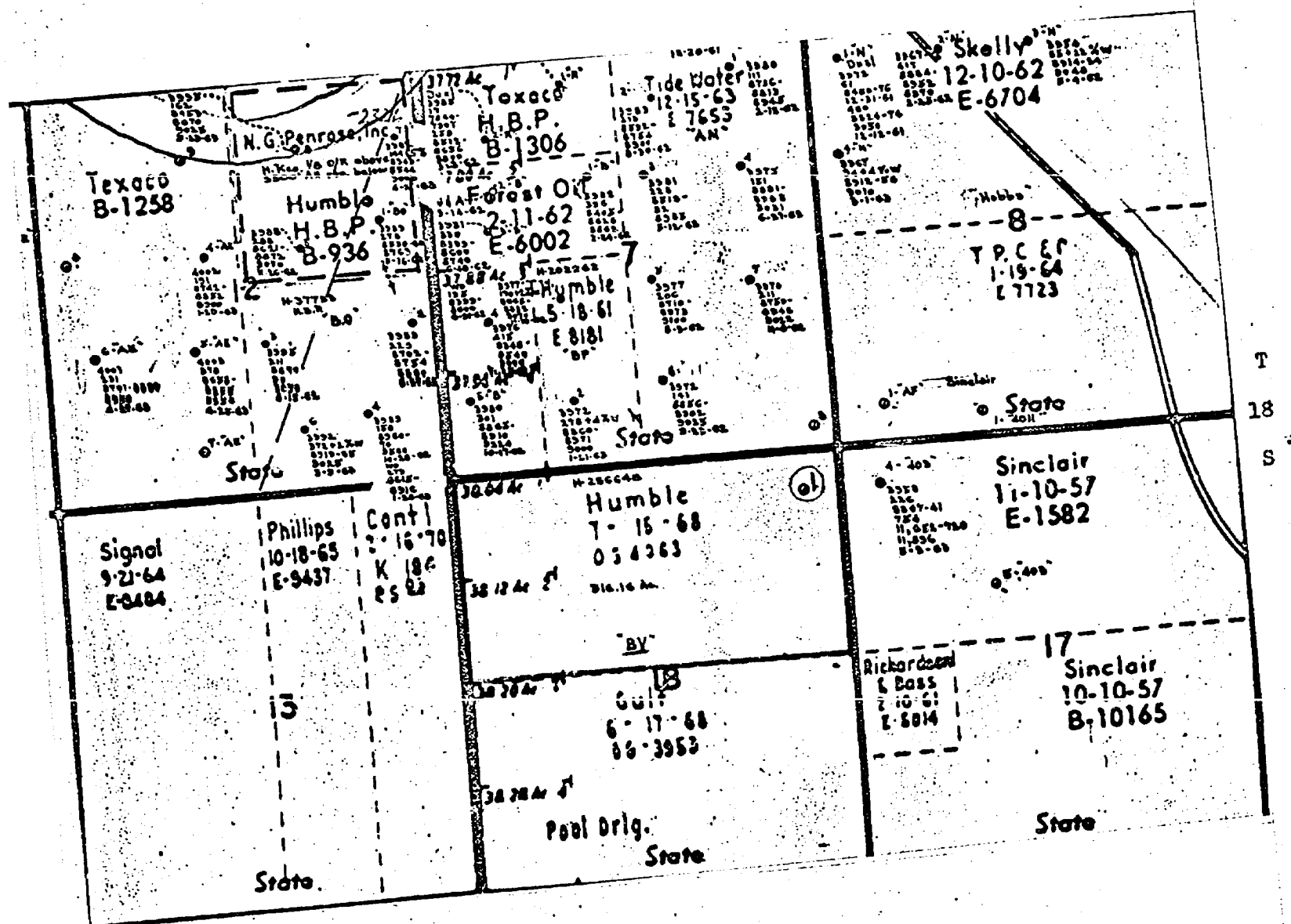
New Mexico State "BV", Well No. 1

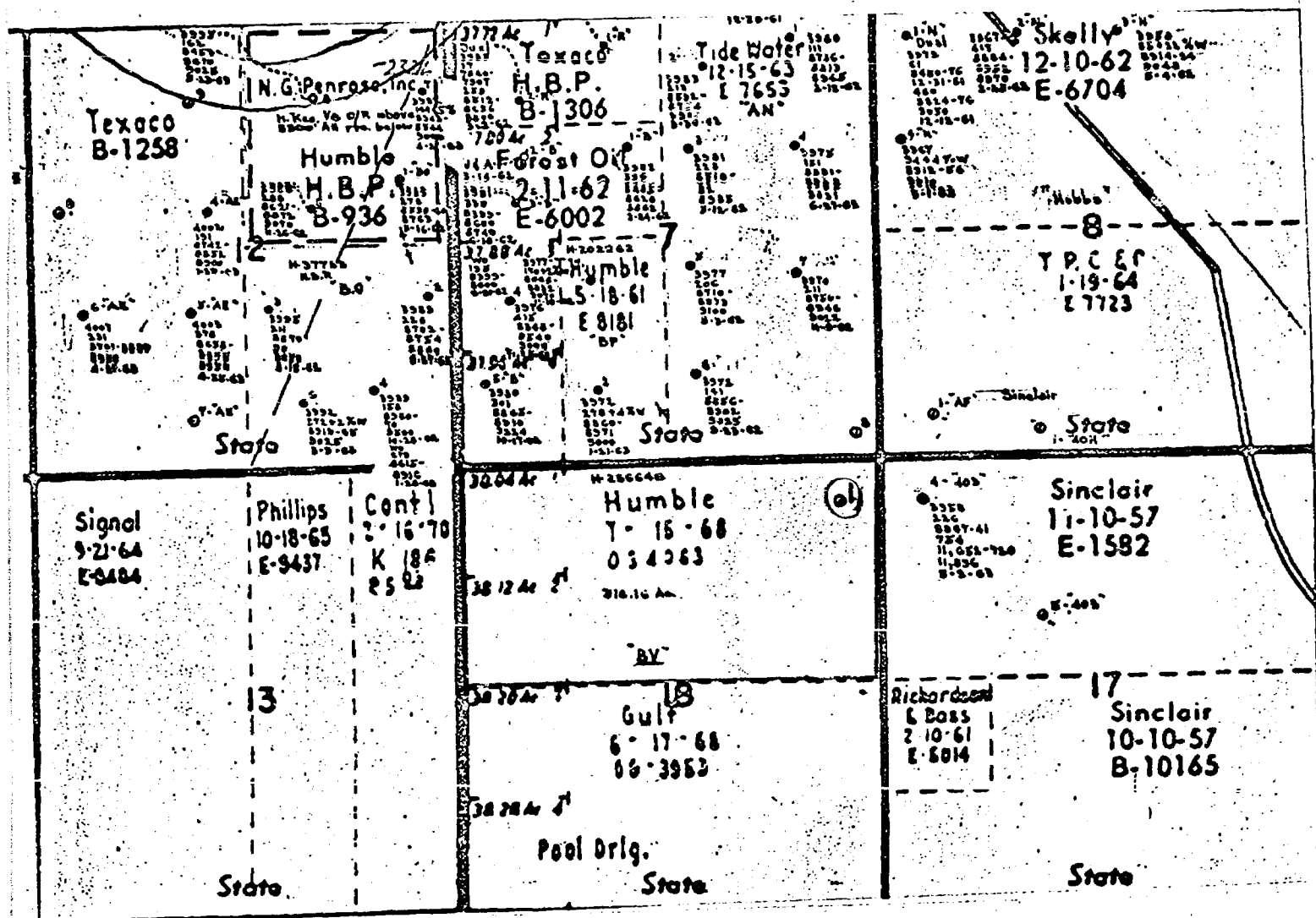

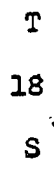
Proposed Dual Completion

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

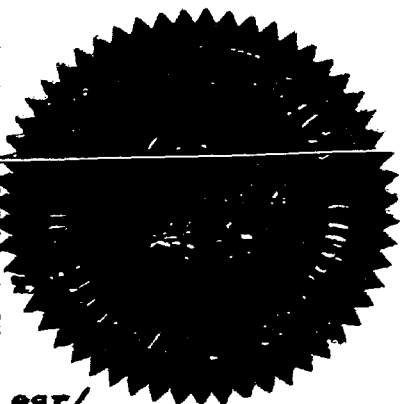
(2) That the attorney for the Commission stated that the applicant had requested, prior to the hearing, that the subject case be dismissed and moved to dismiss the case.
