



We have had communication from an attorney representing the parties in Case 3440 asking for continuance because the attorney was unable to appear at this time without great inconvenience, and also advising that he thinks that these wells will be plugged very shortly and asked for a continuance until the first Examiner Hearing in September.

In Case 3441, we have had communication from Mr. Al Kendrick advising that he has had communication advising that probably that subject well is soon to be plugged and requesting that the case be continued until the first Examiner Hearing in September.

I would like to move that all of these cases be continued until that time.



MR. NUTTER: Thank you, Mr. Hatch. Cases 3439, 3440 and 3441 will be continued to an Examiner Hearing to be held at this same place at 9:00 A.M. September 7th, 1966. With that, we will adjourn the Hearing.
