Your application for a discovery allowable and creation of a new pool does not meet the requirements of Rule 509,

- (a) Paragraph 1. Requires ownership and other data within a two mile radius. You show only one mile west and no ownerships. Also, the scale is supposed to be 1" = 1000".
- (b) Paragraph 5. Was not submitted at all. This reservoir data will be necessary to prove horizontal separation.

The Bough zones have long been established by several companies, and they run from A through F. Your well, the Aztec State No. 2, falls in the "E" zone, with the op of "Canyon" being at 9950 feet in the Pan American State "DL" No. 1 well.

Also, please note that the Delaware Apache State 19 Well No. 1 falls in the "D" zone or below the North Baum Pool rules as established by Order No. R-3644 but is classified as being in the North Baum Pool.

Please resubmit Paragraph No. 1 and Paragraph No. 5. We will have to have the necessary reservoir data from you to show horizontal separation.

Comes now the applicant, Robert B. Holt, whose address is Suite 801, First National Bank Building, Midland, Texas, and applies to the Oil Conservation Commission of New Mexico for establishment of special pool rules for the pool discovered by his #2 Aztec State Well in Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof would show the Commission:

- That applicant is the operator of the Aztec State Well #2, located 660 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the east line of Section 26, Township 13 South, Range 32 East, Lea County, New Mexico.
- The subject well is completed in the Pennsylvanian formation with perforations from 9,743 to 9,799 feet.
- 3. The subject well has discovered a new separate common source of supply which should be designated a Canyon or Middle Pennsylvanian Oil Pool.
- The subject well is presently the only well completed in the subject pool.
- 5. That one well may be reasonably expected to efficiently and economically drain not less than 160 acres.
- 6. That drilling and developing the pool on 40 or 80 acre spacing and proration units would be uneconomical, resulting in waste through the drilling of unnecessary wells, and that such development would not result in the recovery of any significant amounts of additional oil.
- 7. That applicant proposes the adoption of special field rules for the subject pool including the following DOCKET MAILED provisions:

a) Spacing and proration units of 160 acres, consisting of the Northeast quarter, Southeast quarter, Northwest quarter or Southwest quarter of a governmental section, with wells to be located within 150 feet of the center of either quarter-quarter section in the 160-acre unit, together with suitable provisions for exceptions to said rules, assignment of allowables with an 80 acre proportional factor, and such other provisions as the Commission may deem proper.

WHEREFORE, applicant requests the Commission to set this application for hearing before the Commission's duly appointed examiner, and that after notice and hearing as provided by law, the Commission enter its order adopting special pool rules for the subject pool in Lea County, New Mexico.
