MR. NUTTER: Case Number 5955.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 5955, Application of Penroc Oil Corporation for an unorthodox gas well location, Eddy

County, New Mexico.

MR. KELLAHIN: Tom Kellahin of Kellahin & Fox. appearing on behalf of the Penroc Oil Corporation, the applicant, and I have one witness to be sworn.

(THEREUPON, the witness was duly sworn.)

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STERLING J. TALLEY

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. KELLAHIN:

Please state your name, by whom you're employed, Q. and in what capacity.

My name is Sterling Talley, President of Penroc Oil Corporation, Midland, Texas.

What is your area of expertise, Mr. Talley?

I'm a graduate geological engineer of the University of Oklahoma.

And have you previously testified before this Commission and had your qualifications accepted and made a matter of record?

A. Yes, I have, on several occasions.

MR. KELLAHIN: If the Examiner please, are the witness' qualifications acceptable?

MR. NUTTER: Yes, they are.

Q. (Mr. Kellahin continuing.) Mr. Talley, will you refer to Exhibit Number One, identify it, and tell us what you're seeking to accomplish?

A. Exhibit Number One is a map on a four inch equal to one mile scale, covering parts of Angel Ranch and parts of Burton Flat North gas areas in Township 20 South, and a portion of the Ranges 27 and 28 East. It shows the ownership; it also shows all the wells that have been spotted that were drilled to Wolfcamp or deeper. They have been double-circled and the color code in the legend indicates that those in -- colored inside the outer circle are Wolfcamp completions. The orange are Canyon; the red is Atoka, and of course, the yellow are all Morrow completions.

We also see that this map has been contoured on what I call the base of the Morrow limestone, which also is the top of the Morrow -- or the shale-sandstone section.

You'll notice that those contours run essentially northeast-southwest and the dip is to the southeast, interrupted occasionally by a few noses. In the corresponding low areas that exist between those noses you'll notice also that beginning at the north central part of the map there is a red

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dashed line that goes southward through one, two, three, four, five six wells. This is the line of cross-section that we will be looking at on Exhibit Two. The little jigbob down at the bottom there was necessary because the Yates well in the south half of 19 is unavailable because it was a recent completed well.

Also you'll note that in Section 18, the east half has been circumscribed in yellow color. That would be the proration unit that we would ask to be put behind the unorthodox location, that we have indicated there as the proposed location of being in the southwest quarter of the northeast -- southeast quarter of Section 18, and also, a lineage measurement, 1980 feet from the east line; 650 feet from the south line.

Q What is the history behind the proration unit consisting of the west half of Section 18?

A. Well, some time ago Penroc drilled the well called the Number One Foxey-Federal in the southeast of the northwest. It was drilled to the Morrow and completed in the upper Morrow, the west half of that section being put behind it as the proration unit. It was communitized and the reason it was, of course, there were three leases involved in this Section 18 running horizontally east-west. The one lease was the north half north half. The second lease, the south half of the north half, and the third lease being all the south

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half of 18.

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- Would you say those again, please?
- A. The north half north half.
- Q. Okay.
- A South half north half, and the south half.
- Q All right.

A That west half, as I say, was put behind the FoxeyFederal in a communitized fashion, and that being the case,
of course, the reason it was done was there were a couple of
leases in there that were due to expire if this was a dry
hole. Fortunately, it was not.

- Q What would be the standard locations for your proposed proration unit on the east half of 18?
- A. Well, the standard locations as set out by the State Rules and Regulations on the east half would be the inner forties, being one of four locations that could be drilled.
- Q Your proposed unorthodox location is at what footage from the east and south lines?
- A. Well, as I stated awhile ago, it's 1980 from the east and 650 from the south.
- Q All right. Please refer to Exhibit Number Two and identify it.
- A Yes. Exhibit Number Two is the aforementioned cross section that runs in the direction of the red dashed

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line north to south on Exhibit One. We've shown only the lower portion of those logs, primarily to show from above the Morrow section on down to TD. They are not on a horizontal scale, with the vertical scale being two and one-half inches being equal to one hundred feet.

Up near the top you'll see in a Gamma Ray curve a portion of it has been colored red and is merely for correlation purposes; then coming on down to the Morrow line, which is colored blue in the Gamma Ray curve side of the log, and, of course, this cross-section in all these logs are hung on the base of the Morrow line as a reference plane.

Then, proceeding on down you see that the more developed, or the better developed sands in the upper end of the Lower Morrow have been colored yellow and the wellbore sections you see over those wells were perforated upon completion. The last diagnostic correlation would be the top of the Barnett at the base of those sands.

Now, what we're striving to do here, of course, is to move down dip from the well that was previously drilled and establish -- being the Foxey-Federal Number One, completed only in the Upper Morrow. The Lower Morrow sands that are present there are water-bearing, and you'll note as you go south the three remaining wells on that east portion of the cross-section, there are Lower Morrow sands that have been developed that are not present up dip in the Foxey-Federal,

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and also, from which those three wells have been completed successfully as water-free completions. They are also more prolific producers in the upper Morrow sands.

Now, of course, in our opinion there is little doubt that there would be an upper Morrow completion affected at the proposed location, but we feel that this location would also encounter sands that would not be encountered at regular locations, and that being the case, we would recover gas that would not be recovered otherwise.

- Q. In your opinion, Mr. Talley, is the proposed proration unit in the east half of Section 18 reasonably productive from the proposed location?
- A. Now would you repeat your question? I don't understand it.
- Q Yeah. Can you economically and efficiently drain the proposed proration unit from a well located at the proposed location?
 - A Oh, yes, I think so.
- Q In your opinion are you including any acreage in this proration unit that is not productive?
 - A. No.
- Q Were Exhibits One and Two prepared by you directly or under your direction and supervision?
 - A. Yes, they were.
 - Q In your opinion, Mr. Talley, will the approval of

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this application be in the best interests of conservation, prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative rights?

A Yes.

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MR. KELLAHIN: That concludes our direct examination.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Mr. Talley, you mentioned that in the wells on the west side of the cross-section these lower sands were not as well developed. Now, in the wells on the righthand side, where they do have the perforations in the lower section, are the sands in the upper Morrow so poorly developed that it probably doesn't pay to perforate them?

A No, this is not true. For instance, if you'll look at the Cities Service CW well.

- Q Oh, I see, that's the fourth one on --
- A Which is third from the right.
- Q. Third from the right, okay.
- A They elected to complete only in the lower sand, but if you'll notice there are at least four other sands, two in the lower and two in the upper, that would be productive and they will go to those at a later date.
 - Q I see.
 - A Yes.

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- A. Oh, yes, very definitely. I might mention also --
- Q. Then they may have a sand or two in the Upper Morrow in the next well on the right, the Antwell well on--
 - A. Yes, sir, they sure do.
- Now, your wells would more or less correspond --your proposed location would more or less correspond to a
 position between the third and fourth wells here.
 - A Right.
- Q In other words, your Foxey-Federal and the Cities Service well.
 - A That's right.
- Q So you don't know whether you're going to be Upper Morrow or Lower Morrow?
- A. Well, we hope both. I might point out, too, that the Cities Service well, you see, is structurally some 84 feet low to the Foxey-Federal and we think that our proposed location would be some 60 feet lower than the Foxey-Federal, so we feel that the chances of picking up some of these Lower Morrow sands is very good.
- One, which shows the acreage dedication and you've described that Lease Number One here with the north half of the north half, Lease Number Two with the south half of the north half, and Lease Number Three with the south half. Now, all three

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of those leases were communitized for Foxey-Federal and the communitization also applies to the proposed well in the east half, is that correct?

- A No, it would have to be done to include the east half.
 - Q. But it will be the same acreage, won't it?
 - A The same acreage, same ownership, and everything.
- Same ownership and everything. So actually, if the -- if you'd have chosen with certain different ownership the wells could have been dedicated north half and south half here, and they'd both be standard locations.

A. They would have been if they had been horizontal proration units, yes, sir, they would have been a standard location.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Talley? He may be excused. Do you have anything further, Mr. Kellahin?

MR. KELLAHIN: No. sir.

MR. NUTTER: Did you give me the exhibits?

MR. KELLAHIN: Yes.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case Number 5955?

We'll take the case under advisement.
(Hearing concluded.)

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Penroc Oil Corporation, seeks approval of an unorthodox gas well location for its Foxie-Federal Well No. 2 to be drilled 660 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the East line of Section 18, Township 20 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, to test the Morrow formation, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the E/2 of said Section 18 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit.
- (5) That no offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.

(6) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the subject pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That an unorthodox gas well location for the Morrow formation is hereby approved for the Penroc Oil Corporation Foxie-Federal Well No. 2 to be drilled at a point 660 feet from the South line and 1980 feet from the East line of Section 18, Township 20 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- (2) That the E/2 of said Section 18 shall be dedicated to the above-described well.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.
