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MR. NUTTER: We will call Case Number 5980.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 5980, application of Ken
Blackford, et al, for a nonstandard gas proration unit and
an unorthodox gas well location, San Juan County, New Mexico.

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, I'm William F. Carr of Catron, Catron and Sawtell, Santa Fe, appearing on behalf of the applicant, Ken Blackford, et al. I have one witness and four exhibits.

MR. NUTTER: Would your witness stand and be sworn, please.

(THEREUPON, the witness was duly sworn.)

MR. NUTTER: Are there any other appearances in Case 5980? Please proceed, Mr. Carr.

# BILLY F. LATCH

called as a witness, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

# DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. CARR:

- Q. Will you state your full name and place of residence?
- A. I am Billy F. Latch and I live in Durango, Colorado.
- Q Mr. Latch, what is your relationship with the applicant in this case?
  - A. I have been a consultant to Mr. Blackford and

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associated with him in business for some twenty years.

- 0. Have you ever testified before the Commission and had your credentials accepted and made a matter of record?
  - A. Not in this Commission, no, sir.
- Would you briefly summarize for the Examiner your
  educational background and your work experience?
- A. I am a graduate of Colorado College, Colorado Springs.

  I have practiced professionally in the Four-Corners area for the past twenty-three years. I worked for major companies and have been consulting for twenty years. I am a Certified Professional Geologist and a Registered Professional Engineer.
- 0. Have you appeared as an expert witness before other regulatory commissions?
  - A. I have.
- Q. Are you familiar with the application of Ken Blackford, et al in this case?
  - A. Yes.
- Q In a very general way, what does Mr. Blackford seek with this application?
- A. He is seeking an unorthodox proration unit because of the geometric shape of the lease and it also requires a nonstandard location.
- MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, are the witness' qualifications acceptable?
  - MR. NUTTER: yes, they are.

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Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) Will you please refer to what has been marked as Blackford Exhibit Number One and summarize for the Examiner what it shows?

- A Outlined in blue is the acreage in question. The red dot represents the approximate location in which we desire to drill this Pictured Cliffs test.
- Q Does Mr. Blackford have all of the working interest in the one hundred and sixty acres encompassed by the blue line on this exhibit?
  - A. Yes.
- 0. What is the status of the royalty interest under this particular tract?
- A. This is a Federal lease, it belongs to the United States government.
  - Q So the royalty interest is uniform throughout?
  - A. It is.
- Q. Have you attempted to set up a standard proration unit in the northwest quarter of Section 24?
  - A. Yes, we have.
  - Q What efforts have you made?
- A. We have approached our neighbor to the south with the proposal that we trade them our northwest quarter of the southwest quarter for their southeast quarter of the northwest quarter, providing both of us a standard proration unit.
  - Q. And what sort of success did you have in this endeavor?

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A. We have had none.

0. Now will you refer to what has been marked as Blackford Exhibits Two and Three and tell the Examiner what they are?

A. Exhibit Two is Mr. Blackford's letter to Amoco with our proposal to trade acreage or to reach some sort of an amicable agreement regarding this probelm.

Exhibit Three is their answer refusing to take any action.

- Q Mr. Latch, in your opinion is the acreage in question presently being drained in the Pictured Cliffs formation?
- A. Yes, there has recently been completed a well in the southeast quarter of Section 14 which is only some eight hundred feet from our lease line which should definitely result in drainage.
  - Q. Who is the operator of this well?
  - A. R & G Drilling Company.
- Q. You said this is a diagonal offset to your proposed location?
  - A. Well, to our proration unit, yes.
- Are there other offsets producing from the Pictured
   Cliffs formation in the general area?
- A. Yes, there is one well in the northeast-northeast quarter of Section 24 that is a Pictured Cliffs well. The operator is Brad Keyes.
  - Q Are there other nonstandard units in the area?

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A. Yes.

Ω And where would those be located?

A. In Section 24 the Keyes well is in New Mexico Unit "A", northeast-northeast of 24. This well has a hundred and sixty acres dedicated to it and it is on a proration unit which is the mirror image of our request for this proration unit in the section.

MR. NUTTER: By a mirror image, Mr. Latch, you mean that that unit comprises the north half of the northeast, the southeast of the northeast and the northeast of the southeast?

- A. That is correct, sir.
- Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) At this time, Mr. Latch, perhaps you should refer to what has been marked as Exhibit Four. Would you tell the Examiner what is indicated by the red outline on Exhibit Four?
- A. This does show the acreage as dedicated to the Keyes well there in Section 24 that has been approved. This well was drilled some twenty years ago.
  - Q. And the blue line indicates what?
- A. The blue line is the proration unit that we are requesting for this acreage.
- Q Okay. Who owns the remaining one hundred and sixty acres in the west half of Section 24?
  - A. Amoco.
  - Q If your application was approved would you have one

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hundred and sixty contiguous acres to dedicate to a well?

- A. We would.
- Where do you plan to drill a well to which you will dedicate the nonstandard unit?
  - A. The northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of the section.
    - Q. Have you staked a location at this time?
    - A. No, we have not.
  - Q. Where approximately do you plan to drill in terms of footage?
  - A. We will be somewhat controlled by the topography there. We would drill a well approximately eight hundred feet, I have made a ground inspection, approximately eight hundred feet from the north line and eighteen hundred feet from the west line, probably plus or minus a hundred and fifty feet.

MR. CARR: Mr. Examiner, it should be noted that this varies from the location as advertised in this case.

- Q (Mr. Carr continuing.) What types of approval must you obtain before you can stake the location?
- A. We must have the approval of the USGS, we must have an inspection by the GS, the BLM, the Environmentalists and in this particular instance, being near the Salmon ruins definitely an archeologist, all of who must look at the proposed area before we can conduct a survey to drive a stake.

- A. Yes, I have.
- Q. What is their reaction?

A. Favorable. I have contacted the USGS, Mr. Phil McGrath, the District Engineer, and he has indicated insofar as the Federal government is concerned we were within bounds with the proposed location and the proration unit and he knew, subject to no objection to the location, this would, of course, be subject to their inspection.

- Q. Now you have indicated that your objective in drilling this well would be the Pictured Cliffs formation?
  - A. That is correct.
- Q. What do you estimate the total depth of the well to be?
  - A. About seventeen hundred and fifty feet.
- Q. What are the spacing requirements for a Pictured Cliffs well, how many feet must you be from an outer boundary to drill a Pictured Cliffs well?
  - A. Seven hundred and ninety feet.
- Q. Now in view of the shape of the proposed unit, is it possible in your opinion to drill a standard location on this unit?
  - A. No, that is physically impossible with this survey.
- Q. In your opinion would the granting of this application be in the interests of conservation and the prevention of

waste?

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Yes, it would. A.

In your opinion would the granting of the application protect correlative rights?

- A. It would.
- Do you have anything further to offer at this time? Q.
- No, sir. A.
- Now, Mr. Latch, Exhibit One is the plat, was this prepared by you or under your supervision?
  - Yes, it was. A.
- And Exhibits Two and Three were letters that were 12 | between Mr. Blackford and Amoco?
  - Yes. A.
  - Have you reviewed them?
  - Yes, I have.
  - And the final exhibit is an Oil Conservation Commission form with certain additions thereon. Do you know from your own knowledge what is portrayed thereon, Mr. Latch?
    - Yes, I do.

MR. CARR: At this time, Mr. Examiner, we would offer Blackford Exhibits One through Four.

MR. NUTTER: Blackford Exhibits One through Four will be admitted in evidence.

> (THEREUPON, Blackford Exhibits One through Four were admitted into evidence.)

MR. CARR: I have one other question. When are you anticipating that you will be ready to drill, Mr. Latch?

MR. LATCH: We are ready to drill as soon as we can get the proper legal approval and round up the proper equipment We have been in contact with drilling contractors and mud companies such as that and we are prepared to drill as soon as we physically can under legal approval of the location.

MR. CARR: No further questions on direct.

# CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q. Mr. Latch, this is one of those things where the nonstandard location is mandatory if the nonstandard unit is approved but you are not quite prepared yet to say what the nonstandard location will be because you have to have all of these inspections?

A. That's right. I know within plus or minus a hundred and fifty feet of where we would like to drill it, which is certainly at least three hundred and thirty feet from any lease line but due to topography and the possibility of this being an area of archeological interest --

Q. Now you mentioned that there were some kind of ruins, what was that?

A. Yes, the Salmon ruins are only about two to two and a half miles.

# Ω What are those?

A. This is a State Monument of some Indian ruins that have been excavated or are in the process of being excavated and a museum and this is a rather interesting archeological area. I personally have failed to observe anything on the surface that would lead to their wanting us or requiring us to move this location but I'm not an archeologist.

- Q. The archeologist in you says that it's okay?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Some other archeologist might not?
- A. Yes, I admit that I'm not qualified in this field.
- Q. Okay, now, you mentioned that there is a mirror image of this nonstandard proration unit that you are seeking over in the east half of the section. Who owns the remaining acreage in the east half of the section, do you know?
- A. Yes, I don't know for sure which way those units run, whether they are north-south or east-west. Pioneer Production has a Dakota well in the northeast quarter of the section so they must run north-south because the west half is dedicated to a Dakota well in the southwest quarter that is owned by Amoco. So Pioneer must own the deeper and the remaining rights probably in the east half of the section. I do not know for positive.
- Q. I just wondered if you knew whether Amoco also owned the mirror image of the acreage that they own in the west half?

- Q In your Exhibit Number Two, I believe Mr. Blackford offered to exchange acreage with Amoco so that the two companies would have a standard one hundred and sixty acre unit?
  - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. And in their letter of June 3rd they declined to swap forties?
  - A. Yes, sir.
  - Q. And also to farm out their forty?
  - A. Yes, sir.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions? By the way, Mr. Latch, I believe that it would probably be possible to get administrative approval for the nonstandard location when you do finally determine what it is going to be, without the necessity of another hearing, in the absence of any objection from the offset operators.

MR. LATCH: Thank you.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Latch? He may be excused.

(THEREUPON, the witness was excused.)

MR. NUTTER: Do you have anything further, Mr. Carr?

MR. CARR: Nothing further, Mr. Examiner.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case 5980? We will take the case under advisement.

# ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

# BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on July 6, 1977, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner, Daniel S. Nutter.

NOW, on this 19th day of July, 1977, the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

### FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Ken Blackford, et al., seeks approval of a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit comprising the N/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4 and NW/4 SW/4 of Section 24, Township 29 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, to be dedicated to a well to be drilled at an unorthodox location 660 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the West line of said Section 24, or at some other as yet undetermined unorthodox location.
- (3) That the entire non-standard proration unit may reasonably be presumed productive of gas from the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pool and that the entire non-standard gas proration unit can be efficiently and economically drained and developed by the aforesaid well.

-2-Case No. 5980 Order No. R-5494

(4) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce his just and equitable share of the gas in the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pcol, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- (1) That a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit in the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pool comprising the N/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4 and NW/4 SW/4 of Section 24, Township 29 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, is hereby established and dedicated to a well to be drilled at an unorthodox location 660 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the West line of said Section 24, or at some other as yet undetermined unorthodox location.
- (2) That should said well be drilled at some other as yet undetermined location, applicant must receive approval for such location from the Commission in accordance with usual procedures for such approval.
- (3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.





- 3. Applicants are unable to create a standard proration unit in the NW/4 of said Section 24 due to the unwillingness of the owner of the SE/4 NW/4 of said Section 24 to either exchange property with the applicants or farm out the SE/4 NW/4 of said Section 24 to the applicants.
- 4. Applicants seek an exception to the well location requirements of Oil Conservation Commission Rule 104, C, II(b) to permit the drilling of a well at a point 660 feet from the north line and 1980 feet from the west line of said Section 24 to test the Pictured Cliffs formation.



- 5. That it is necessary to drill at this location because of topographical conditions.
- 6. That the above-mentioned 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit should be dedicated to such well.
- 7. That approval of this Application will afford Applicants the opportunity to produce their just and equitable share of the gas in the Pictured Cliffs formation and will protect correlative rights.

WHEREFORE, Ken Blackford, et al., request that this Application be set for hearing before a duly appointed examiner of the Oil Conservation Commission on July 6, 1977, that notice be given as required by law and the Rules of the Commission, that the Commission enter its order granting the Applicants permission to drill a well to test the Pictured Cliffs formation at a point 660 feet from the north line and 1980 feet from the west line of said Section 24, and that the N/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4 and NW/4 SW/4 of said Section 24 be dedicated to this well.

## BY THE COMMISSION:

This cause came on for hearing at 9 a.m. on July 6

19 77, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, before Examiner Baniel S. Nutter

NOW, on this day of July , 19 77 , the Commission, a quorum being present, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

### FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Ken Blackford, et al., seeks approval of a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit comprising the N/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4 and NW/4 SW/4 of Section 24, Township 29 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, to be dedicated to a well to be drilled at an unorthodox location. 660 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the West line of said Section 24, or at some other as yet undetermined unorthodox location.

- (3) That the entire non-standard proration unit may reasonably be presumed productive of gas from the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pool and that the entire non-standard gas proration unit can be efficiently and economically drained and developed by the aforesaid well.
- (4) That approval of the subject application will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce his just and equitable share of the gas in the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pool, will prevent the economic loss caused by the drilling of unnecessary wells, avoid the augmentation of risk arising from the drilling of an excessive number of wells, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

# IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That a 160-acre non-standard gas proration unit in the Fulcher Kutz-Pictured Cliffs Pool comprising the N/2 NW/4, SW/4 NW/4 and NW/4 SW/4 of Section 24, Township 29 North, Range 12 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, is hereby established and dedicated to a well to be drilled at an unorthodox location 660 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the West line of said Section 24, or 21 same that as petundatermined knorthodox location.

(3) That jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Commission may deem necessary.

(2) That should said wree be drilled at some other as yet undetermined location, applicant must receive approval for such location from the Commission prior to in accordance with usual procedures for such approval.
