Q. Would you state for the Examiner when and where you obtained your degree?

A. From the University of Texas at Austin, a B.S. in geology, in 1948. Same school, a Masters in 1949. I worked for Argo Oil Corporation from 1949 to 1961, both west Texas and southeast New Mexico.

Since then I've been a consultant working both southeast New Mexico and west Texas, and during the period '71 - '75 I did extensive work in New Mexico for ATAPCO and Ensearch. These were Pennsylvanian studies.

MR. KELLAHIN: Are the witness' qualifications acceptable, Mr. Examiner?

MR. STAMETS: They are.

Q. (Mr. Kellahin continuing.) Mr. Kennedy, would you refer to what we've marked as Exhibit Number One, identify it, and tell me what the applicant is seeking to accomplish?

A. We are -- Exhibit One is two plats, really, one with the land deleted, and the second part has all the land information there.

The part bordered in yellow is a working interest unit. All of the operators in that area have agreed and we are in the process of signing an operating agreement, I think it's signed by practically everyone, to drill a well in the south half of Section Five.

The red outlined area is the gas proration unit

- Q What's the footage location for the proposed well?
- A. 1980 south and 660 east.
- Q. That's in Section 5?
- A. Yes, Section 5, 19, 26.
- Q. Would you refer to what has been marked as Exhibit

 Number Two and identify it?
- A. Exhibit Number Two is a Xeroxed copy of a portion of a log from the northeast quarter of 5, 19, 26.
- Q. Would you -- would you identify the well from which you derived this log?
- A. Yes, it's the Samedan Number One Ivy, 1980 north and 660 east from 5, 19, 26.
- Q. What's the importance of Exhibit Two to us, Mr. Kennedy?
- A. I've marked my structural horizon and the isopack units, which are arbitrary, Morrow A, Morrow Upper B, and Morrow Lower B.

It refers to the exhibits three, four, five, six.

- Q. Let's refer to Exhibit Three and have you identify that and explain the information.
- A. Exhibit Three is a structural map, mapped on what I call the top of Morrow B, which is a shale zone in the middle of the Morrow plastic section. The Morrow in this particular area of Eddy County is essentially a dip slope,

dipping from northwest to southeast. Occasionally there are structural salients, such as that in the area of the drill site, but it's basically a dip slope area.

- Q There's a well located in Section 5 in the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter. Could you describe the status of that well?
 - A. It's a dry hole.
 - Q. In what Morrow zones was it tested?
- A. It ran a drill stem test -- well, I'll have to look that up. Let me check that. Basically, it was a no sand well, except the lower B sand and that was not tested, and it was only a few feet high to the lower B sands in the well in Section 4, which production tested water.

I don't know if I have a drill stem test on that.

- Q You've answered the question.
- A. But the As and Upper Bs were missing. The Lower B was not tested. I presume it was considered water because it was tested water in the Number One Ivy -- I mean the well in Section 4.
- Q Tell me about the well in Section 4? What Morrow zones does it produce from?
- A. That produces from the Morrow A zone. It's a non-commercial from a thin, approximately five inch, sand.
- Q Let's direct your attention to Exhibit Number Four, Mr. Kennedy, and have you explain what information it

contains.

A. Back to that other one, if -- I don't think they ran any drill stem tests. If they did, they did not recover any commercial shows of hydrocarbons.

You're on Number Four?

- Q. Yes, sir.
- Morrow A sands, which you can identify that time unit on the log. There's a good well producing from that zone, or part of a section, Section 19, 18, 26. The well in 5 produces in that zone, but it's too thin to be commercial; it's a light producer. A well in 18, 19, 26 had a good show of gas but produced water. There was a little show of gas in the well in the northeast quarter of 32, 18, 25.

We are attempting to -- the A sands are generally thin in this area. We think that we have to be in the center of the channels to get the good production, where the thick sands are, and that's what we're attempting to do at that location.

- Q. Please identify Exhibit Five.
- A. Exhibit Five is Upper B Isopack. This is net feet of porous sand and there are good wells producing in 18, 19, and 7,18,26, and in 24, and 18, 25.

Those on the margins of that area away from the axis of the channel are non-commercial or dry holes. There

have been significant shows in this area but nothing commercial, and we are trying to get as close to -- as we can, to the center of the channel, and also in the best structural position.

Q. Exhibit Number Six.

An Isopack map of the Lower B sands, which is the main pay in the Atoka Field. The production in the thick parts of the channel to the north is very good. There have been significant shows in this area in 18, but very little sand and much loss of pressure on a series of drill stem tests in Section 18, 19, 26. For this reason we want to, again, get into a thick center of a channel and hope to get commercial production.

What do you estimate to be the depth of the pro-Q. posed well?

Approximately 9500 feet.

In your opinion, Mr. Kennedy, is the south half of Section 5 reasonably productive from the Morrow formation as you've studied it?

Yes, I think we can expect reasonable production. A.

Can the south half of Section Five be economically and efficiently drained by a well located at the proposed location?

A. Yes.

Q. In your opinion will the granting of this application be in the best interests of conservation, prevention of waste, and the protection of correlative rights?

A. Yes.
