0 Mr. Vasicik, would you refer to what I have marked as Applicant Exhibit Number 1, and identify it?

A This is a surveyor's plat which shows V-F Petroleum as operator where we propose to drill a well on the Lease in Section 29, Township 8, Range 38 East, Roosevelt County, New Mexico.

This well is located -- this location is located in the North Sawyer - Devonian Pool. This pool has one producer originally, which is the Tom Ingram Well to the southeast -- the southwest.

Q Let's refer to Exhibit Number 2 and have you discuss this Devonian structure plat.

A. This is a small structure from what we think covers very little area. Tom Ingram Well to the southwest had produced 262,000 barrels out of the Devonian before it started making a considerable amount of water, at which time it was plugged and abandoned.

We propose to drill this location and we wish to

drill an unorthodox location so that we can recover more oil than we would from a regular location.
