MR. NUTTER: Call Case No. 6075.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 6075, Application of Amoco Production Company for an unorthodox oil well location, Lea County, New Mexico.

MR. BUELL: For Amoco Production Company, Mr. Examiner, my name is Guy Buell. We have one witness, Mr. Pease.

(Witness sworn.)

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Buell, are you a member of the New Mexico bar?

MR. BUELL: No, but I've been certified by a New Mexico lawyer.

MR. NUTTER: I see.

MR. BUELL: It's in your file. I have a copy.

MR. NUTTER: Yeah, we've got an appearance for you

MR. BUELL: I've been vouched for.

By way of a brief opening statement, Mr. Examiner.

I might point out that we have a two-pronged reason for requesting this unorthodox location. First and foremost, we want it to meet an offsetting unorthodox location on the offsetting Exxon Knight lease. Their Knight No. 2 has recently been completed at an unorthodox location in the Upper Yeso.

The second reason for our request for this location is that, as our testimony will show, this is a very gassy

 reservoir, and we hope to make a low gas-oil ratio completion at this particular location.

J. E. PEASE

being called as a witness, and being duly sworn upon his oath, testified as follows, to-wit:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. BUELL:

Q. Mr. Pease, would you state your complete name, by whom you're employed, in what capacity, and what location, please, sir?

A. My name is James E. Pease. I'm employed by Amoco Production Company in Houston, Texas, as a Staff Engineer, Senior Grade.

A Yes, sir.

MR. BUELL: Mr. Examiner, are there any questions as to Mr. Pease' qualifications, with particular reference to the Fowler-Upper Yeso area?

MR. NUTTER: No. Mr. Pease is qualified.

(By Mr. Buell) Mr. Pease, in connection with your testimony here today, look first, if you will, at what has

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been identified as Amoco's Exhibit No. 1, and state for the record what that exhibit reflects.

- A. Exhibit 1 is a map of the Fowler field area. South Mattix Unit is shown by the heavy dashed line.
- Q Mr. Pease, who are our working interest partners in the South Mattix Unit?
 - A. Continental, Chevron, Arco, and Tenneco.
- Q. All right, sir, now this hearing today relates to the Upper Yeso. Would you briefly state for the record the origin of the Fowler-Upper Yeso Pool?
- A. Yes. Order R-3987, effective July 15th, 1970, consolidated the Fowler-Blinebry and the Fowler-Lower Paddock, to form the Fowler-Upper Yeso Pool.
- Q All right, sir. Now, I would take it by looking at your Exhibit No. 1 that this is a multi-pay area, and that we have production from other reservoirs than the Upper Yeso, is that correct?
 - A. That is correct.
- Q. For the record, what are some of the other producing zones that we find in the Fowler area?
- A. We have the Seven Rivers and the Queen; we have the plain Paddock, Tubb, Devonian, and in the past the Fusselman has produced, and the Ellenberger is currently being produced.
 - Q And the Ellenberger. All right, sir, since this

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hearing relates entirely to the Upper Yeso, why have you distinguished those wells that are currently completed in and producing from the Upper Yeso?

- A These are shown by the yellow-orange dots.
- Q All right, sir. How have you identified the location for South Mattix Unit, or as I'll refer to it from now on, the SMU Well No. 30?

A. This is shown by the red dot. Its location is 330 feet from the south line, and 330 feet from the east line, placing it in Unit P of Section 15, Township 24 South, Range 37 East of Lea County, New Mexico.

- Q. Why is this location unorthodox?
- A. Rule No. 4 of the Fowler-Upper Yeso rules specifies that the wells are to be located within 150 feet of the center of any quarter quarter-section.
- Q. All right, sir. I mentioned the Exxon Knight
 No. 2 in my opening statement. Would you locate that well
 for the Examiner, and for the record, please?
- A. This well is located 330 feet from the west line, and 330 feet from the south line of Section 14, just due east of the proposed South Mattix Unit Well No. 30.

MR. NUTTER. That's the Exxon well?

A. Yes, sir.

MR. NUTTER: And it's a 330-330 location?

- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. (By Mr. Buell) Is that a recent completion?

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A. Yes, sir.

- Q. What is the significance of the red arrow that you have pointing in the direction of the Exxon Knight No. 2?
- A. The red arrows on the map indicate exceptions to the spacing rule for the Fowler-Upper Yeso, those that have previously been granted.
- Q In other words, the red arrows identify other unorthodox locations --
 - A. That's correct.
- Q -- approved by the Commission? How many are they, total, including the Knight No. 2?
 - A. Six.
- Q. All right, sir, looking back at Exhibit No. 1, in the area of our proposed location for SMU Well No. 30, do you feel that by directly and equally meeting the offsetting Exxon Knight No. 2, that the correlative rights of all the interest owners in the South Mattix Unit will be protected?
 - A. I do.
- Q. All right, sir. I notice there are two well locations, or two blue dots here on this exhibit, both of which are in the South Mattix Unit. What are the significance of those dots?
- A. These are orthodox locations which have been permitted; Well No. 27 --
 - Q. All right, sir --

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MR. NUTTER: By permitted, you mean they have a drilling permit but have not been drilled yet?

A. Well 27 is actually being drilled. It may be down about TD today.

MR. NUTTER: But that's what you meant, approved locations?

A. Yes, sir.

Q (By Mr. Buell) I notice in the vicinity of each completed and producing Upper Yeso well you have in blue, a number. What is the significance of that number?

A. This represents the gas-oil ratio for the well.

Most of them are the averages for 1976.

Q All right, sir. Will you do this for me, and for the record? Would you compare the currently -- strike the word currently -- would you compare the gas-oil ratios as shown on our Exhibit 1, in the area of the location for SMU No. 30?

A. Well, South Mattix Unit 16, July test, was 135,000 cubic feet per barrel of oil. South Mattix Unit 23 was 102,571 cubic feet per barrel. This was also a July test.

The Exxon Knight No. 2, gas-oil ratio for that well was 3,000 mcf a day, and that's from its potential test.

Q All right, sir. Looking at those ratios, the location of SMU 30, what would you, what type of ratio would you predict for a well at the ocation we're requesting

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	A.	Ιt	would	be	somewhere	between	the	100,000	and
the	3,000.								

- Q. But we should obtain a lower gas-oil ratio than that reflected for SMU No. 16 and No. 23?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Well, while probably not as low as the Exxon Knight
 No. 2?
 - A. That's correct.
- Q All right, sir. I also notice a trace connecting SMU Wells No. 24 and 8, and the Exxon Knight No. 2. Is that the trace of a cross-section?
 - A. Yes, sir. That would be Exhibit No. 2.
 - Q. Are you ready to go into that exhibit now?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q Turn then, if you would, to what has been identified as Amoco's Exhibit 2, and state for the record, if you will, the wells from which three logs were used to compose this cross section.
- A. They are the Amoco South Mattix Unit No. 24, on the left; South Mattix Unit No. 8, and the Exxon Knight No. 2.
- Q. All right, sir, how have you shown where a well would fall on this cross-section, drilled at the location we're requesting for SMU No. 30?
- A. We've shown it by the wellbore symbol there between the two wells.
 - Q. Is that the scale, and is that approximately where

it will fall on this section?

A. Yes, sir.

All right, sir, what data have you reflected on this, the cross-section? And ly that, I'm talking about the data reflected by the line running from left to right? Why don't you start at the top and work your way right down to the bottom?

A. At the top, we've labeled the top of the Upper Yeso pay, labeled the gas-oil contact within the pay zone. The minus 2300 represents the datum on which the wells' logs were hung, and at the bottom we have the top of the Tubb Zone which would be the base of the Upper Yeso pay zone.

Q All right, sir, what does this exhibit depict structurally with regard to the location of SMU No. 30?

A. It would be located down-depth from Unit No. 8, and slightly up-depth from the Exxon Knight No. 2.

Q. Do you feel, in this particular pool, Mr. Pease, that it's in the interest of conservation to complete a producing well with as low a gas-oil ratio as possible?

A. I do.

Q Do you feel that this location that we're requesting, then will serve conservation in that we anticipate a much lower ratio than that of the up-structure wells 23 and 16?

A. Yes, sir.

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Q. And you've already testified that the location i
needed to protect the correlative rights of all the owners
at interest in the South Mattix Unit, from the unorthodox
offset the Exxon Knight No. 2?

- A. That's correct.
- Q Do you have anything else you'd care to add at this time, Mr. Pease?
 - A. No, sir.

MR. BUELL: May it please the Examiner, that concludes our Direct. I would like to formally offer into evidence Amoco's Exhibit 1 and 2.

MR. NUTTER: Amoco's Exhibit 1 and 2 will be admitted in evidence.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

- Q Mr. Pease, do you happen to know the order number that approved the Exxon non-standard location?
 - A. It was NSL-874.
 - Q And that was approved administratively, then?
- A. Yes, sir. It was a recompletion of a well that was recompleted from the Ellenberger.
- Q. I see. But your well will be a completely new well, so therefore it had to come for a hearing for an exception
 - A. That's correct.

Q. I see.

A. All of the other red arrows are administrative exceptions, except for the Exxon AB No. 2, located over in Section 16. And I believe a formal order was issued for that because they wanted to do a completed in the Blinebry and the Ellenberger.

And I guess we can assume that inasmuch as Exxon got their administrative order, that Amoco did not object to the application for the non-standard location?

A. That's correct.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any further questions of Mr. Pease?

You may be excused. Did you have anything further, Mr. Buell?

MR. BUELL: No, Mr. Examiner, I do not.

MR. NUTTER: Does anyone have anything they wish to offer in Case No. 6075? We'll take the case under advisement.

(Hearing concluded.)

FINDS:

- (1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Commission has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.
- (2) That the applicant, Amoco Production Company, seeks approval of an unorthodox oil well location for its South Mattix Unit Well No. 30 located 330 feet from the South line and 330 feet from the East line of Section 15, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Fowler-Upper Yeso Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.
