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MR. STAMETS: Call next case, Case 6087.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Case 6087, application of Yates Petroleum Corporation for an unorthodox gas well location, Eddy County, New Mexico.

MR. LOSEE: A. J. Losee, appearing on behalf of the applicant and I have one witness.

(THEREUPON, the witness was sworn.)

RAY BECK

was called as a witness by the applicant, and having been first duly sworn, testified upon his oath as follows, to-wit:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. LOSEE:

- Would you state your name and residence? Q.
- Ray Beck, Artesia, New Mexico.
- What is your occupation?
- Petroleum Geologist, Yates Petroleum Corporation.
- You have previously testified before this Commission as an expert geologist have you not?
 - Yes, I have.
- Would you explain the purpose of the application in Case 6087?
- Case 6087, Yates Petroleum Corporation seeks approval of the unorthodox gas well location of its proposed No. 1

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Ralph Nix IT Well to be drilled six hundred sixty feet from the south line and nine hundred ninety feet from the east line of Section 13, Township 20 South, Range 24 East, Eddy County.

The south half of Section 13 would be dedicated to the well.

- Q. Please turn to what has been marked as Exhibit One and explain what is portrayed by this exhibit?
- A Exhibit One is a land plat showing the proposed location and its relationship to the surrounding leasehold situations.
- Q The yellow acreage, I take it, is Yates Petroleum acreage?
 - A Yes, sir, that's right.
 - Q Okay. Turn to Exhibit Two and identify it, please?
- A Exhibit Two is a map showing a solid countour and the thickness and approximate aerial extent of the upper Morrow channel sand reservoir.

The dotted contours show the structural attitude on to of the Morrow Clastic.

Three wells in Sections 19 and 30 of 20, 25, penetrated the eastern or down dip finger of the channel and tested water with gas shows.

One well, the Humble Hobbs, in Section 24 of 20, 24, was drilled to the Ellinburger in 1950 and penetrated

the upper Morrow channel although it was not tested before Humble abandoned the well.

Nine years later Western Drilling attempted a completion in the Morrow channel. After acidizing and fracking the well flowed an estimated rate of one million cubic feet a day without reported water.

However, evidently, not all of the lode was recovered and the well was plugged and abandoned.

It is believed that the Upper Morrow sands in the Humble Hobbs would have been gas productive had it not been severely damaged by fresh water mud during the drilling of the well to the Ellinburger and during the nine years it was plugged before the completion attempt by Western Drilling.

Interpretation of the pertinent data obtained by a study of the Morrow section in the well as shown on the map indicates that the proposed location, unorthodox location, is well placed to enounter the gas production of the Upper Morrow channel sand reservoir.

The well is shown as gas productive on the map are productive in zones other than the Upper Morrow channels.

Q Turn to Exhibit Three and which is your east-west cross section and point out what is important to this application?

A. Exhibit Number Three is a west through east cross section showing the top of the Morrow Clastics and other

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correlations and the previously mentioned Upper Morrow channel sands and also it shows the pertinent testing and pertinent data.

- On each of those four wells?
- A. Yes, -- well, one well, the Humble Hobbs, is not shown on the cross section because it is only available on a small scale log and it doesn't show on these logs.

I have it in my briefcase if we need it as an exhibit.

- Q Were Exhibits One through Three prepared by you or under your direction?
 - A. I prepared them.
- Q Do you have an opinion as to whether or not drilling this Ralph Nix IT No. 1 Well at the proposed unorthodox location will avoid the unnecessary drilling of wells and otherwise prevent waste?
 - A. Yes, it will.
 - And protect correlative rights of the owners?
 - A. Yes.

MR. LOSEE: That's all on direct.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. STAMETS:

Q Mr. Beck, do you have any theories why the Morrow channels were laid down along the section line?

I have no opinion.

MR. STAMETS: Are there any questions of this witness? He may be excused. Anything further in this case? Take the case under advisement.

- (2) That the applicant, Yates PetroLeum Corporation, seeks approval of an unorthodox gas well location 660 feet from the South line and 990 feet from the East line of Section 13, Township 20 South, Range 24 East, NMPM, to test the Wolfcamp and Pennsylvanian formations, Cemetary Field, Eddy County, New Mexico.
- (3) That the S/2 of said Section 13 is to be dedicated to the well.
- (4) That a well at said unorthodox location will better enable applicant to produce the gas underlying the proration unit.
- (5) That no offset operator objected to the proposed unorthodox location.


