Gentlemen:

Your agency issued a \$25,000.00 Statewide Oil and Gas Bond in favor of Marion B. Edmonds and O. A. Peters to cover operations conducted on Public land within the state of New Mexico. Said bond, Employees Fire Insurance Company FY 18594, is still in effect.

By letter of June 23, 1978, you were advised that operations conducted by Edmonds and Peters on Federal oil and gas lease NM-797 were unsatisfactory. They have failed to plug and abandon their No. 1 well, a dry hole located in the SW 1/4 sec. 3, T. 15 N., R. 33 E., Harding County. Repeated attempts by the U.S. Geological Survey, as well as the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission, to obtain compliance with plugging instructions have been unsuccessful. Our last written attempt to contact these operators was sent by Certified Mail on September 13, 1978, and was returned as "unclaimed." A copy of this letter is attached hereto for your records.

Unless other acceptable arrangements are promptly made by you as surety, we shall proceed to have the well plugged by a qualified contracting firm. Expenses for the plugging operations will be billed to Commercial Union Assurance Companies.

Gentlemen:

Our records indicate that Marion B. Edmonds and O. A. Peters, records lessees of terminated lease NM-797, drilled the No. 1 Edmonds and Peters well, located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 3, T. 15 N., R. 33 E., Harding County, New Mexico, on subject lease.

By letter of April 12, 1973, we replied to your request of April 7, 1973, for an acceptable plugging program. On October 10, 1974, we sent you a certified letter regarding plugging of the well and filing of delinquent reports. On March 8, 1976, we requested immediate plugging of the well and advised that failure to do so would result in transfer of liability to your bonding company. On June 23, 1978, we advised your bonding company of non-compliance with Federal Regulations and terms of the lease. Order No. R-5719 of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ordered the well to be plugged or put on production. To our knowledge, you have taken no action on this well in response to the above requests.

You are hereby allowed 30 days from the date of this letter to file "Intent to Abandon" plug the well, file five copies of Subsequent Report of Abandonment, file four copies of Completion Report (form 9-330) and restore the surface to the satisfaction of the surface owner. A plugging program acceptable to both U.S.G.S. and the State of New Mexico would be as follows:

1. Heavy mud between all plugs.
2. Cement plug from 700' to total depth of 807'.
3. Cement plug from 175' to 225'.
4. 10 sack cement plug at surface with regulation marker.

Failure to comply with the above requests will result in contract plugging of the well with transfer of liability of the plugging expenses to your bonding company. The New Mexico Oil Conservation Division has advised me that contract plugging of wells in this area cost about \$7500 for individual wells.

MS. TESCHENDORF: Lynn Teschendorf, appearing on behalf of the Division. I would like the record to reflect that my witness, Mr. Carl Ulvog, has been previously sworn and qualified.

MR. NUTTER: Mr. Ulvog is under oath and he is qualified.

CARL ULVOG

the witness herein, having been previously sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MS. TESCHENDORF:

Q Mr. Ulvog, are you familiar with the subject matter of Case 6199?

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SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO 87501

A Yes, I am.

Q Have you reviewed all the reports filed with the Division concerning this well?

A I have.

Q Would you please summarize those records for the Examiner?

A Yes, I will. The application for permit to drill this well was filed with the United States Geological Survey on April 16, 1969. I won't go into the plan of drilling. The next report that was filed with the United States Geological Survey, of which we have a copy, was received January 4, 1972 in Durango, Colorado. And it states the well reached a total depth of 817 feet, operations had been suspended on July 10, 1969 and they had made a drilling deal with another company to take over the well.

The next report in the file with the Geological Survey was July 6th--pardon me, I'm a little out of order, was a report filed with the United States Geological Survey and I don't know what the date was that it was received there. But it states that there was 200 feet of ten and three-quarters inch casing set July 2, 1969 and cemented with 75 sacks of cement which circulated it to

the surface.

Then we had another report filed, apparently in response to communication from the Geological Survey which states, total depth 817 feet, operations suspended July 10, 1969, plan to start back in spring of this year.

The next report we have is from the operator to the district supervisor of the Geological Survey at Durango, in which he states that the Farmot deal that they had made had fallen through and they had taken-- they were now wanting to plug and abandon the well and is asking for a plugging program. I don't know whether they got a plugging program, but the well is still not plugged.

There are water wells, two water wells, each of which are about 330 to 350 feet away, which obtain their water at 160 feet. The well is probably not plugged, they engaged the land owner, which is frontend loader to remove the blowout preventor, I don't have the exact date, but he did lift that out of the cellar and he doesn't know whether there was anything put over the top of the casing or not. But now the casing is not visible. I did locate the cellar, the corners of which the planks are showing. So I knew where the casing would be and it was buried at a depth of approximately three or four feet.

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This is all that I know about the well.

Q Is there a bond running to the Division on this well?

A No, there is not. This is a Federal well.

Q In your opinion, could the failure to plug this well cause waste?

A It could, although I don't know if there was any oil or gas shoals encountered. But they probably did and if so, that could cause waste by that escaping from the formation.

But probably the worse situation is the pollution of the ground water.

MS. TESCHENDORF: I have nothing further.

MR. NUTTER: Are there any questions of Mr. Ulvog? He may be excused. Does anyone have anything further to offer in Case No. 6199?

We will take the case under advisement.

NOW, on this 9th day of May, 1978, the Division Director, having considered the testimony, the record, and the recommendations of the Examiner, and being fully advised in the premises,

FINDS:

(1) That due public notice having been given as required by law, the Division has jurisdiction of this cause and the subject matter thereof.

(2) That Marion B. Edmonds and O. A. Peters are the owners and operators of the Edmonds & Peters Federal Well No. 1, located in Unit M of Section 3, Township 15 North, Range 33 East, NMPM, Harding County, New Mexico.

(3) That in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights said Edmonds & Peters Federal Well No. 1 should be plugged and abandoned in accordance with a program approved by the Santa Fe District Office of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division on or before July 1, 1978, or the well should be returned to active drilling status or placed on production.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

(1) That Marion B. Edmonds and O. A. Peters are hereby ordered to plug and abandon the Edmonds & Peters Federal Well No. 1, located in Unit M of Section 3, Township 15 North, Range 33 East, NMPM, Harding County, New Mexico, or in the alternative, to return the well to active drilling status

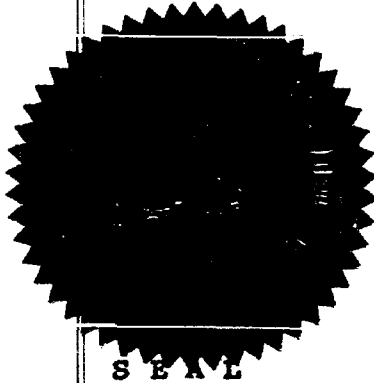

Otherwise, affix to back of article. Endorse front of article **RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED** adjacent to the number.
4. If you want delivery restricted to the addressee, or to an authorized agent of the addressee, endorse **RESTRICTED DELIVERY** on the front of the article.
5. Enter fees for the services requested in the appropriate spaces on the front of this receipt. If return receipt is requested, check the applicable blocks in item 1 of Form 3811.
6. Save this receipt and present it if you make inquiry.
