Oil Conservation Division.

Q Have you previously testified before the Division and are your credentials a matter of record?

- A. I have and they are.
- Q Does District III include that part of the San Juan County that's involved in this case?
 - A. Yes.
- Q Do your duties as District Supervisor include making recommendations to the Division as to when wells should be plugged and abandoned?
 - A. Yes.
- Q Are you ramiliar with the subject matter of this case?
 - A. I am.
- Q Have you reviewed all the records filed with the Division concerning the Black Diamond Well No. 1?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q And do you have these reports with you?
 - A. I do.
- Q Would you please refer to those reports and summarize the well history?
- A. The only information we have about the Black Diamond Oil Company well is that it was drilled in 1930 and completed in 1931. We have a scout ticket card taken from the Bureau of Mines records. We do not have any of-

ficial Oil Commission or Oil Division records relating to this well.

The information that we have is that the well was 800 feet deep. The field inspection discloses that the well is cased and that the casing is open and the well is flowing water on the outside of this casing. We suspected this casing to be surface packer. It appears to be 7-inch or 8-5/8ths in the photograph that I have.

- Q Is that scout ticket marked as Exhibit One?
- A I have a copy of the scout ticket card and a copy of the photograph, taken by Charles Golson of our office, who is our Field Man, which I would exhibit -- submit as Exhibit One.
 - Q What type of acreage is this well on?
 - A. It's on fee land.
 - Q. Is there a bond covering this well?
 - A. No
- Q In your opinion could the failure to plug this well cause waste of hydrocarbons or contaminate fresh water supplies?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q Will you elaborate on how that could happen?
- A. The proximity of where this well was drilled, there was shallow oil production. This well was drilled for shallow oil production. Since we have no records,

we're not sure of whether or not they penetrated any oil or gas producing sands, but if those are opened, the failure of this casing would allow the contamination of water zones or oil zones or both.

Q Are you prepared to recommend a plugging program at this time or would you prefer to describe the program at the actual time of the plugging?

A. I would prefer to not include the plugging program in this order.

MS. TESCHENDORF: At this time I'd like to offer Exhibit One in evidence, and I have nothing further.

CROSS EXAMINATION

BY MR. NUTTER:

Q Mr. Kendrick, what size casing does it appear is in the subject well?

A. I'm not sure. It appears to be either 7-inch or 8-5/8ths.

Q. And you mentioned that water is flowing from the well. Is that coming from the casing or around the casing?

A. Around the casing.

Q. So you don't know if there's any cement on the casing or if so, how much, or the depth of the casing?

A No, sir, we have no casing record whatsoever.

Q I see. The only record you have is this old scout ticket?

A Yes, sir.

Q Do you know anything about the Black Diamond Oil Company?

A. No.

Q Are they doing business at the present time in your area?

A. No, sir, they have not done business in our area in the last twenty-five years.

Q I see. Does anyone have any further questions of Mr. Kendrick?

MS. TESCHENDORF: Did you have anything further you wanted to add?

A. Yes, I'd recommend that this well be riugged and abandoned or made into a useful well. I suspect that it should be plugged.

Q Do you know if the landowner is interested in the well for any purpose? You said it was on fee land.

A Mr. Golson advised me that he had visited with the landowner about it and the landowner said he would be glad to give us access to the well and to allow us to enter his property to plug and abandon the well. He did not show any interest in it, salvaging the well for a water well or anything like that. or make it into a useful well, you really don't have any intention of making it any kind of a useful well?

A. In the absence of Black Diamond Oil Company surfacing, I doubt that would be the proper approach.

MR. NUTTER: Thank you, Mr. Kendrick.

Does anyone else have anything they wish to offer in this case? We'll take the case under advisement.
