Q Are you familiar with the subject matter of

CROSS EXAMINATION

Q Mr. Kendrick, do you know whether some individual or company or anyone has a lease on this particular fee land?

A. Yes. The land is leased and gas wells have this acreage dedicated to them, so the minerals are under lease.

Q. Has any contact been made with the minerals lessees to see if they would be interested in completing this well as an oil well?

A. I'm sure that the field minerals owner has contacted people and they simply have no interest in this well.

The scout ticket information does not show the historic completion dates. It indicates 10-inch casing set at 55 feet; 6-5/8ths inch casing set at 647 feet; the well was drilled to a total depth of 740 feet, and had an initial potential of 2-million feet of gas.

The photograph indicates the well to have a swage and a valve at the surface, implying that casing is -- or the well is not tubed but the casing is hung on a casing clamp.

Mr. Golson advises me that there is water flowing outside the casing string, which would indicate that this long string of casing set on a casing clamp, is not cemented to a sufficient height of cement to prevent a waterflow.

- Is that exhibit with the photograph and the scout ticket marked Exhibit Two?
 - It is Exhibit Two in this case.
 - What type of acreage is this well on?
 - This well is on fee acreage.
 - And is there a bond covering the well?
 - There is no bond.
- In your opinion could the failure to plug this well cause waste of hydrocarbons or contamination of fresh water supplies?




