The Crow Canyon Unit Agreement, San Juan County, New Mexico was approved June 28, 2016 and effective August 1, 2013. This agreement has been assigned case recordation number NMNM135203X. The basic information associated with this unit is as follows:

- This is an Undivided Unit and only the Mancos Formation is unitized.
- 2. This unit includes Federal, State and Indian Allotted mineral estates.
- 3. The leases committed to the Crow Canyon Unit will not be horizontally segregated.
- 4. The Escrito D30-2408 #01H well is the initial obligation well. The surface hole location is located in the NW/4NW/4, Section 30, T.24 N., R.8 W., San Juan County, New Mexico. The well name Escrito D30-2408 #01H for needs to be changed to the Crow Canyon Unit well name.
- 5. The following Federal leases contain lands both inside and outside the Grow Canyon Unit and are subject to segregation provisions pursuant to 43 CFR 3107.3-2, Segregation of leases committed in part:

The Crow Canyon Unit embraces 13,604.06 acres more or less, of which 640.00 acres (4.7045%) are Indian allotted lands; 1,920.00 acres (14.1134%) are State Lands; and 11,044.06 acres

(81:1821%) are Federal lands. All lands embraced within the Crow Canyon Unit are fully committed.

In view of the foregoing commitment status, effective control of the unit area has been setablished. We are of the opinion that this agreement is in the public interest and for the purpose of more properly conserving natural resources.

In accordance with Article 9 of the Unit Agreement Escrito D30-2408 #01H has been drilled, completed on September 27, 2013. The public interest requirement for the Crow Canyon Unit agreement has been satisfied. Pursuant to the subsequent drilling obligations of Section 10 of the unit agreement, a Plan of Development is required to be filed yearly.

Approval of this agreement does not warrant or certify that the operator thereof and other holders of operating rights hold legal or equitable title to those rights in the subject leases which are committed hereto.
