SUBJECT: Barclay State #5 Location Exception

Attached are:

1. Structure Map Top of Brushy Canyon A Sandstone
2. Cross-Section Sand Dunes Barclay State #5

The primary objective at the State #5 is the Brushy Canyon E sand (this is the zone on the attached cross-section the lies between the Brushy Canyon E top and the Brushy Canyon E1 Mkr top). We believe that the Brushy Canyon E sandstone is the primary producing zone within our acreage block (highlighted in yellow on the attached Structure Map). The Brushy Canyon E was recently perforated and fracture stimulated in the Barclay Federal #2 (green perforations on Cross-Section) for 40 BOPD, 64 MCFGPD and 350 BWD. Prior to adding this zone, the Barclay Federal #2 was producing 9 BOD, 17 MCFGPD and 264 BWD.

As shown on the attached cross-section, the Brushy Canyon E sandstone is present in all wells except the Barclay State #9 (please see gamma curve for this well on the cross-section). These data indicate that the Brushy Canyon E sandstone pinches out between the State #3, State #2 and State #3, and the State #9. It is my opinion that the Brushy Canyon A sandstone is not present at a legal location in the SW NE of Section 2-T23S-R31E; whereas, a location 1,500' FNL and 1,400' FEL of Section 2-T23S-R31E would encounter the up-dip edge of the Brushy Canyon A sandstone.
