Administrative Order NSL-4405

Dear Ms. Cole:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your application submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") on February 8, 2000; and (ii) the Division's records in Santa Fe: all concerning Burlington Resources Oil & Gas Company's ("Burlington") request for an unorthodox gas well location within the Angels Peak-Gallup Associated Pool for the existing Huerfano Unit Well No. 211 (API No. 30-045-20778), located 1550 feet from the North line and 1500 feet from the West line (Unit F) of Section 10, Township 26 North, Range 10 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico.

According to the Division's well records the Huerfano Unit Well No. 211 was initially drilled in 1971 by El Paso Natural Gas Company and completed in the Basin-Dakota Pool as an initial well within a standard 320-acre stand-up gas spacing and proration unit comprising the W/2 of Section 10 at a standard gas well location.

It is our understanding that Burlington intends to abandon the Dakota interval within this wellbore and recomplete up-hole into the Gallup formation in an attempt to establish commercial gas production.

Further, the W/2 of Section 10 is also to be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 320-acre stand-up gas spacing and proration unit for the Angels Peak-Gallup Associated Pool.

The location of this well is considered to be unorthodox pursuant to Rule 2(b) of the "General Rules and Regulations for the Associated Oil and Gas Pools of Northwest New Mexico and Southeast New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations for the Angels Peak-Gallup Associated Pool," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-5353, as amended.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(c) of these special pool rules, the above-described unorthodox Gallup gas well location for the Huerfano Unit Well No. 211 is hereby approved.

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Once the Gallup interval in this well is successfully completed and should the completion be classified an "oil well", the operator shall seek an amendment to this order pursuant to Rules 2(b) and (c) of these special rules.
