Dear Mr. Stogner:


On January 19, 2000, Cross Timbers Oil Company requested the above referenced unorthodox location. On February 10, 2000, your office issued order NSL-4403. When Cross Timbers first started to look for a location for this well, it was determined that the primary location and the alternate location were both going to require an unorthodox location. Therefore, we applied for our primary location. Since the time period of our internal work for the locations, the set back rules have changed and our alternate location would now conform to existing rules.

The above captioned location is in a box canyon and the surface owner is planning on building a house in the canyon. The surface owner was concerned about the visual impact, but the main concern was with the potential noise from a compressor and pumping unit.

Cross Timbers has decided to move this well to our alternate location of 1,980' FNL and 1,975' FEL of the Section. This change is being done to comply with the existing spacing rules and to accommodate concerns of the surface owner.

This letter is to advise you of our location change and to explain our position for not drilling in the location that was granted. I know that you put in a great deal of work into the review and granting of unorthodox location request. This letter is not a requirement, but I felt I should explain why we now will drill in a location that conforms to the current spacing rules.
