Reference is made to your application received on September 16, 2014.

You have requested to drill this well at an unorthodox oil well location described above in the referenced pool or formation. This location is governed by special pool rules for the Lindrith Gallup-Dakota, West Pool which provides for 160-acre units with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit or lot outer boundary, nor closer than 330 feet from any governmental quarter-quarter section line. This location is less than 330 feet from a quarter-quarter section line.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 19.15.15.13 NMAC and 19.15.4.12.A (2) NMAC.

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It is our understanding that you are seeking this location because of topographic issues within the SE/4 of Section 26.

It is also understood that notice of this application to offsetting operators or owners is unnecessary due to common ownership.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 19.15.15.13 (B) NMAC, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division 19.15.5.9 NMAC.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
