Subject: New Mexico State Land Office Objection to Application by Longfellow Energy, LP (Ozzy 18 State SWD #1)

Good afternoon-

The New Mexico State Land Office objects to the application recently filed by Longfellow Energy, LP for the Ozzy 18 State SWD #1 well located in Unit J, Section 18, T17S, R29E, Eddy County, NM.

This objection is based on several grounds. The first reason is that the proposed location of the SWD at 2280 From the South and 1972 from the East is a standard location for oil wells (wells less than 330 feet from the Unit boundary are considered standard locations). Operators would have to change the surface location of vertical wells or change the horizontal well path. This could adversely affect the state land trust by stranding oil and gas reserves. SWD operators now locate the proposed SWD wells in unorthodox locations (less than 330 feet from Unit boundaries) for this exact reason.

The other reason is unnecessary surface disturbance, because Longfellow would have to build a new pad for the SWD, instead of using the existing pad at the Empire 18 State #8, which is also operated by Longfellow.

The State Land Office may determine that there are additional grounds for its objection. Please let me know if you have any questions or need additional information.
