Reference is made to your application received on October 2, 2014.

You have requested to drill this well at an unorthodox oil well location described above in the referenced pools or formations. This location for the Vacuum; Abo Reef is governed by statewide Rule 19.15.15.9.A NMAC, which provides for 40-acre units with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. The perforated interval is less than 330 feet from a unit outer boundary.

This location for the Vacuum; Wolfcamp and Vacuum; Upper Penn is governed by the Special Rules for each which provides for 80-acre units, with wells located at least 200 feet from a center of a governmental quarter-quarter section. The perforated intervals in these pools will not be within 200 feet of the center of the quarter-quarter section.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 15.13 19.15.15.13 NMAC and 19.15.4.12.A (2) NMAC.

An unorthodox location is necessary to avoid surface obstructions, and recover additional reserves in the three pools in Unit F.

It is also understood that you have given due notice of this application to all operators or owners who are "affected persons," as defined in Rule 19.15.4.12 A (2) NMAC, in all adjoining units towards which the proposed location encroaches.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 19.15.15.13 (B) NMAC, the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 19.15.5.9 NMAC.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
