The commingled oil and gas production shall be measured and sold at the Morgan Fee Com Well No. 1H Central Tank Battery (CTB) located in Unit M, Section 21, Township 24 South, Range 29 East, Eddy County, New Mexico.


Oil and gas production from each of the leases shall be separately metered before commingling with production from other wells. The allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly in accordance with Rule 19.15.12.10.C (2) NMAC.

The operator shall notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

The operator shall notify the Artesia district office of the Division upon commencement of commingling operations.

This approval is subject to like approval from the New Mexico State Land Office (NMSLO) before commencement of the commingling operations.
