The Farmington District Office (FDO) of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has received your letter dated October 21, 1996, applying for downhole commingling approval for the Pinon Fruitland Sand and the West Kutz Pictured Cliffs formation in the above referenced well.

Allocation for this well will use the subtraction method. Future gas production will be projected for the Fruitland Sand formation using a 5.7% annual decline rate from an initial rate of 58 Mcfd. The production will be allocated by taking the difference of the total production and the forecasted Fruitland Sand production to determine the Pictured Cliffs production. No liquid production is anticipated from either of these zones.

Approval to downhole commingle the Pinon Fruitland Sand and the West Kutz Pictured Cliffs formations for the above referenced well is hereby granted.
