The combined project area for these wells include S/2 N/2 and the S/2 of Section 27, Township 17, South, Range 28, East, Eddy County, New Mexico.

The commingled oil and gas production from the wells detailed above shall be measured and sold at the Halberd 27 State Well No. 3H central tank battery (CTB), located in Unit H, of Section 27, Township 17 South, Range 28 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico.

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The oil and gas production from each of the diversely-owned leases shall be separately metered a combination of well testing and metering.

The allocation meters shall be calibrated quarterly in accordance with Rule 19.15.12.10.C (2) NMAC.

Subsequently drilled wells that produce from the subject pool within the project areas approved by this order may be added to this commingling authority by submittal of a Sundry Notice to the Engineering Bureau in Santa Fe.

Two of the wells in the application share the same project area; however the ownership is diverse in all wells. Therefore, each well is considered a unique lease.

This installation shall be installed and operated in accordance with the applicable Division Rules. It is the responsibility of the producer to notify the transporter of this commingling authority.

The operator shall notify the Artesia District office of the Division prior to implementation of the commingling operations.
