Dear Mr. Frank:

Under the provisions of General Rule 111 (c), (d) and (e), Union Texas Petroleum Corporation made application to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division on April 18, 1988, for authorization to directionally drill its proposed McCord Well No. 2E. Basin-Dakota Pool, San Juan County, New Mexico.

The Division Director Finds That:

- The application has been duly filed under the provisions of Rule 11 (1) (d) and (e) of the Division General Rules and Regulations;
- (2) Satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified;
- applicant has presented satisfactory evidence that all (3) requirements prescribed in General Rule 111 will be met; and
- (4) No objections have been received within the waiting period prescribed by said rule.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The applicant, Union Texas Petroleum Corporation, is hereby (1) authorized to directionally drill its McCord Well No. 2E, the surface location of which shall be 860 feet from the North line and 1550 feet from the West line (Unit C) of Section 34, Township 30 North, Range 13 West, NMPM, San Juan County, New Mexico, by kicking off from the vertical and drilling in such a manner as to bottom in the Basin Dakota Pool within 50 feet of a previously approved unorthodox gas well location (Division Administrative Order NSL-2338) 1900 feet from the South line and 2000 feet from the East line (Unit J) of said Section 34.

PROVIDED HOWEVER THAT: prior to directional drilling, the operator shall determine the subsurface location of the kick-off point; and

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT: subsequent to the above-described directional drilling, should said well be a producer, a continuous multi-shot directional survey shall be made of the wellbore from total depth to kick-off point with shot points not more than 100 feet apart; the operator shall cause the surveying company to forward a copy of the survey report directly to the Santa Fe office of the Division. 310 Old Santa Fe Trail, Room 206, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87503, and the operator shall notify the Division's Aztec District Office of the date and time said survey is to be commenced.

- Form C-105 shall be filed in accordance with Division Rule 1105 and the operator shall indicate thereon true vertical depth in addition to measured depths.
- This well will be an infill well to the applicant's existing McCord Well No. 2 located at a standard gas well location 1850 feet from the South line 1190 feet from the West line (Unit L) of said Section 34. The S/2 of said Section 34 to be dedicated to both wells forming a standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit for said pool
- Jurisdiction of this cause is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.

Dear Mr. LeMay:

Union Texas Petroleum (UTP) requests administrative approval to intentionally deviate a well from vertical. UTP desires to place the McCord 2E at a surface location of 860' FNL and 1550' FWL of Section 34, T30N-R13W. This location will be on UTP's McCord 3E well pad (see attached) which is located outside of the Farmington City limits.

UTP intends to directionally drill the McCord 2E from the aforementioned surface location to a bottomhole location of 1900' FSL & 2000' FEL of Section 34, T30N-R13W. This is an unorthodox location which was approved April 21, 1987 pursuant to Administrative Order NSL-2338.

UTP requests this approval for two reasons:

No. 1

The well was initially planned to be drilled straight at the unorthodox location referenced above. After <u>lengthy</u> discussions with the surface landowner and his attorney, UTP could not come to terms for a surface damage agreement. This unorthodox well location is located in a proposed subdivision within the City of Farmington.

No. 2

The proposed surface location will be outside of the City of Farmington and thereby will eliminate the necessity of buried tanks and complying with the City requirements when drilling and producing a well within the City limits. Another benefit of drilling from this location is that a pipeline tie-in is readily available from the existing McCord 3E pipeline.

UTP believes that by granting approval to intentionally deviate this well from vertical it will prevent waste by allowing UTP to produce a well which may never be drilled if the approval is not granted. In addition, UTP believes that all correlative rights will be protected by granting this application.

Pursuant to Rule 111-(d), UTP realizes that an acceptable bottom-hole location will not be farther than 50' away from the approved unorthodox location of 1900' FSL & 2000' FEL, Section 34, T30N-R13W. Pursuant to Rule 111-(e), UTP has notified the off-setting proration unit operators of our intentions. The operators were notified by certified mail as of this date, a copy of which is attached for your review.



Union Texas Petroleum has requested administrative approval to drill a directional well from a surface location of 860' FNL and 1550' FWL to an approved unorthodox bottomhole location of 1900' FSL and 2000' FEL, Section 34, T30N-R13W (see attached).

Our request is necessitated by the surface owner requesting and demanding exorbitant surface damages and favors. In order to eliminate a court battle we have elected to move the surface location outside of the Farmington City limits.
