## AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER DHC-2863

James Ranch Unit No. 27 API No. 30-015-31033 Unit I, Section 36, Township 22 South, Range 30 East, NMPM, Eddy County, New Mexico Southeast Quahada Ridge-Delaware (Oil – 50443), Los Medanos-Bone Spring (Oil – 40295) and Los Medanos-Wolfcamp (Oil – 96597) Pools

Dear Ms. Wilber:

Reference is made to your recent application for an amendment to Division Order No. DHC-2863 dated December 22, 2000, which order authorized the downhole commingling of Los Medanos-Bone Spring and Los Medanos-Wolfcamp Pool production in the well, to add the Southeast Quahada Ridge-Delaware as a third commingled zone in the well.

It appearing that the subject well qualifies for approval for such amendment pursuant to the provisions of Rule 303.C., and that reservoir damage or waste will not result from such downhole commingling, and correlative rights will not be violated thereby, you are hereby authorized to commingle the production as described above and any Division Order which authorized the dual completion and required separation of the zones is hereby placed in abeyance.

In accordance with the provisions of Rule 303.C.(1), each of the commingled pools shall be allowed to produce up to the top oil allowable and top casinghead gas allowable applicable for that pool.

Assignment of allowable to the well and allocation of production from the well shall be on the following basis:

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Los Medanos-Bone Spring Pool	Oil-26%	Gas-13.5%
Southeast Quahada Ridge-Delaware Pool	Oil-48%	Gas-73%
Los Medanos-Wolfcamp Pool	Oil-26%	Gas-13.5%

REMARKS: The operator shall notify the Artesia District Office of the Division upon implementation of the commingling process.

Pursuant to Rule 303.C.(2), the commingling authority granted herein may be rescinded by the Division Director if conservation is not being best served by such commingling.
