Well Location for Gulf's Vinson-

Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation hereby makes application for adminis-  
trative approval for an unorthodox well location for the producing  
well of a non-standard gas proration unit comprising NE/4 of Section  
12, T-26-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico, which was submitted to  
your office on April 4, 1959, and in support thereof states the  
following facts:

- (1) Gulf Oil Corporation is owner and operator of an oil and gas lease known as its Vinson-Ramsay "A" Lease, Lea County, New Mexico, as shown on the attached plat.
- (2) The Vinson-Ramsay "A" Well No. 2 located 1980 feet from the north line and 330 feet from the east line of Section 12, T-26-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico, was originally drilled and completed as a dry hole on July 8, 1941. The well was re-entered on April 21, 1958, and was recompleted as a gas well August 20, 1958, in the Jalmat Gas Pool.
- (3) The unorthodox well location will meet the requirements of Rule 3 of the Oil Conservation Commission Order R-520 as follows:
  - (a) The Vinson-Ramsay "A" Well No. 2 was drilled prior to issuance of Order R-520, and the request for an unorthodox location is sought under provisions of Rule 3 of this order.

- (b) By copy of this letter of application, all operators within 1980 feet of the well are notified by registered mail of the intent of Gulf Oil Corporation to obtain an unorthodox location and are requested to make any objections thereto known to the Commission within twenty days. (See attached affidavit.)
- (4) The approval of this application for an unorthodox location will, in the opinion of the applicant, prevent waste, protect correlative rights, and serve the best interest of conservation.

In view of the existence of the facts herein stated and compliance with the provisions of Rule 3 of the Oil Conservation Commission's Order R-520, Gulf Oil Corporation requests that the Secretary of the Commission approve the above described unorthodox well location.


