Administrative Order NSL-297-A

Dear Mr. Phillips:

Reference is made to the following: (i) your telephone conversations with Mr. Michael E. Stogner, Engineer/Chief Hearing Officer with the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division ("Division") in Santa Fe on Tuesday, July 11, 2000; (ii) your application telefaxed to Santa Fe on July 11, 2000; (iii) supplemental information also telefaxed on July 11, 2000; and (iv) the records of the Division: all concerning Union Oil Company of California's ("UNOCAL") request for an exception to the well location requirements provided within the "*Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool*," as promulgated by Division Order No. R-10987, for a non-standard infill gas well location in an existing standard 320-acre lay-down gas spacing and proration unit for the Basin-Dakota Pool comprising the S/2 of Section 17, Township 27 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico. This unit is currently dedicated to UNOCAL's Rincon Unit Well No. 155 (API No. 30-039-07024), located at an unorthodox initial gas well location (approved by Division Administrative Order NSL-297, dated May 21, 1962) 990 feet from the South line and 590 feet from the West line (Unit M) of Section 17.

The application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 605.B.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F (2), the following described well to be drilled at an unorthodox infill gas well location in Section 17 is hereby approved:

**Rincon Unit Well No. 155-M
1940' FSL & 500' FEL (Unit I)**

Further, both of the aforementioned Rincon Unit Wells No. 155 and 155-M and existing gas spacing and proration unit will be subject to all existing rules, regulations, policies, and procedures applicable to prorated gas pools in Northwest, New Mexico.
