## Administrative Order NSL-5563

## Re: Burch Keely Unit Well No. 976 L-13-17S-29E Eddy County

Dear Mr. Miller:

Reference is made to the following:

(a) your application (administrative application reference No. pTDS07-02648558) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico on January 26, 2007, and

(b) the Division's records pertinent to this request.

Marbob Energy Corporation (Marbob) has requested to drill its Burch Keely Unit Well No. 976 at an unorthodox well location, 2595 feet from the South line and 330 feet from the West line (Unit L) of Section 13, Township 17 South, Range 29 East, N.M.P.M., in Eddy County, New Mexico. The NW/4 SW/4 of Section 13 will be dedicated to this well in order to form a standard 40-acre spacing unit in the Grayburg Jackson-Seven Rivers/Queen Grayburg/San Andres Pool (28509). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 104.B, which provides for 40-acres units, with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is approximately 45 feet from the northern unit boundary.

Your application has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 1210.A(2).

It is our understanding that Marbob is seeking this location to conform to the waterflood design for this approved secondary recovery unit.

It is also understood that both the subject spacing unit and the offsetting unit to the north are included in the Burch Keely Unit of which Marbob is the designated operator, and that the unit agreement provides for allocation of production from both tracts to the same persons in identical proportions. Accordingly, there are no affected persons to whom notice of this application is required.

Pursuant to the authority granted me under the provisions of Division Rule 104.F(2), the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
