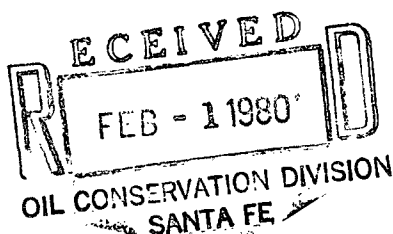
Dear Sir:

Administrative approval of an unorthodox location is sought for subject well based upon topographic conditions as provided for under NMOC Rule 104F. The standard location falls in a draw near some archeological findings and the BLM have asked us to move the location 200' north and 100' east which sets the location on more suitable ground for a drill site and away from their artifact scene.

The east 320 acres spacing is ¹⁷⁸⁰dedicated to the Iwanowski MM Federal No. 1. The non-standard location is 1980' FNL and 560' FEL. The attached ownership map shows the new proposed location with Yates Petroleum owning offset acreage by purchase or farm-out from J. J. Grynberg and an option from McClellan Oil Co.

Yates Petroleum waives objection to the unorthodox location and we have a rig ready to move on this location as soon as it is approved.

Enclosed please find NMAS' Archaeological Clearance Report for YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION's Iwanowski MM Federal Well No. 1, its access road, and the modifications to the existing ranch road in Chaves County, New Mexico. Two archaeological sites, NMAS 5042 and NMAS 5043 were recorded during this reconnaissance. NMAS recommends for YATES PETROLEUM CORPORATION's proposed Iwanowski MM Federal Well No. 1 provided this location be shifted 200 ft to the north and 100 ft to the east, i.e., 1780 FNL and 560 FEL of Section 34, T6S, R24E. NMAS strongly recommends that men and materiel be confined strictly to the suggested work area in order to ensure 5042 and 5043's integrity. NMAS is thus suggesting clearance for this project.

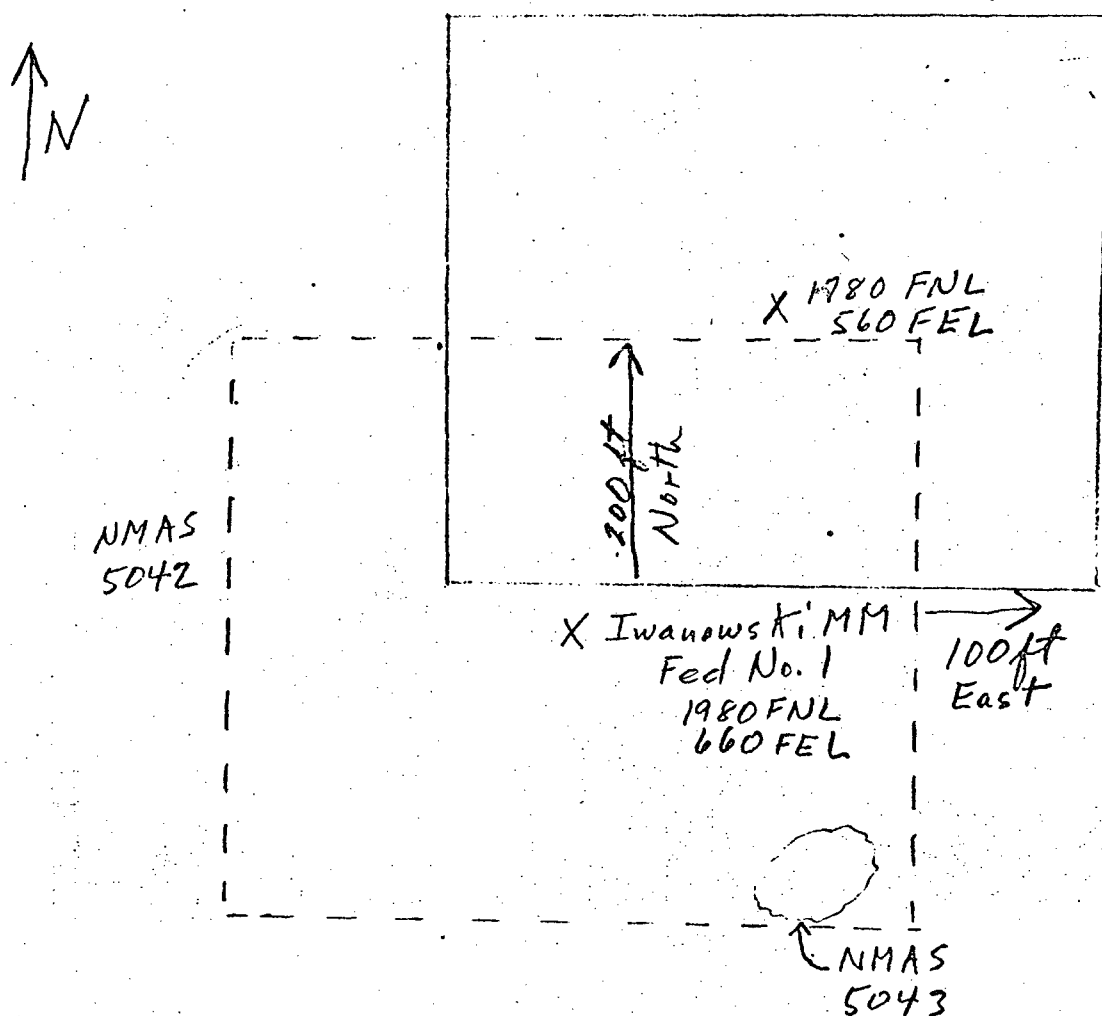
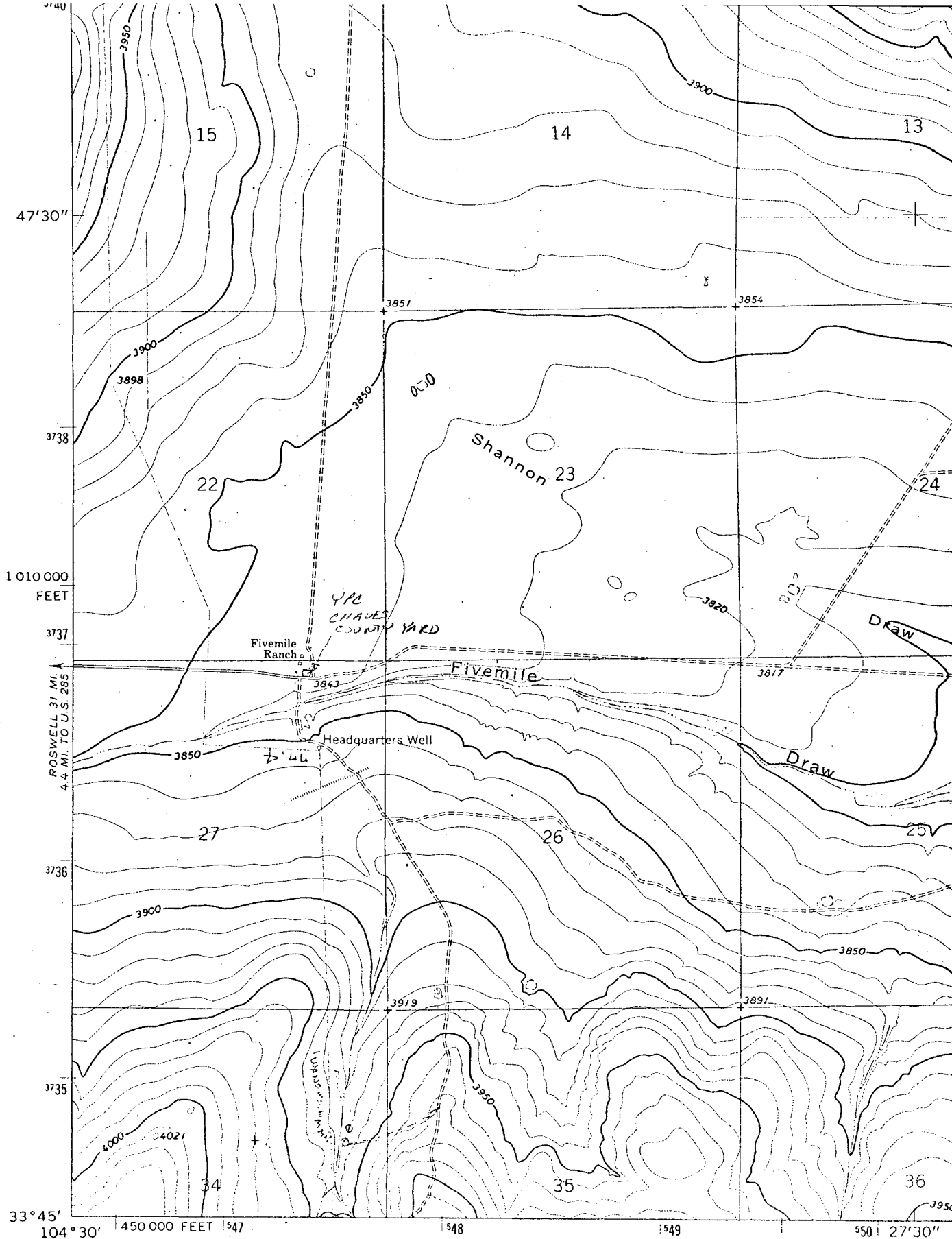


Fig. 1. Schematic representation of NMAAS 5042 and NMAAS 5043 vis a vis YATES PETROELUM CORPORATION's proposed Iwanowski MM Federal Well No. 1 and its suggested relocation at 1780 ft FNL and 560 ft FEL of Section 34, T6S, R24E, NMPM, Chaves County, New Mexico.

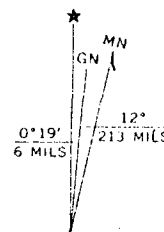
