





Thank you for your letter of June 8, 1981 about an archeological site (NM-06-2188) at the proposed location of a well in Section 30, T85, R26E.

Having read the information you sent us about this site, and the archeologist's recommendation that it be avoided, I concur that the site has yielded significant information on regional prehistory, and could yield further information under more intensive investigation. Accordingly, it is my opinion that it meets one criterion of National Register eligibility. Under the circumstances, avoidance of the site by the proposed undertaking is undoubtedly the simplest and least expensive procedure.

Thank you for your continuing cooperation. Please let me know if I can provide further information or consultation.



As stated in our memorandum of 23 April 1981 Ann Ramage, staff archeologist, conducted an archeological survey of the proposed location of the #3 Acme well for Mesa Petroleum. At this time an extensive prehistoric site (NM-06-2188) was found. This site extended into the area of the proposed well location.

Site NM-06-2188 consists of concentrations of burned rock indicating cooking activities and lithic material including cores, flakes and manos.

It is recommended that Mesa's #3 Acme well be moved to 2150 FSL, 2050 FEL, Sec. 30, T. 8 S., R. 26 E., to avoid impacting archeological site NM-06-2188.

If the location is not moved and Mesa undertakes the drilling they could face trespass charges for damaging the archeological site. Recent experience has indicated the mitigation of a damaged site is very costly.

A copy of this letter and the site form are being sent to the State Historic Preservation Officer, Tom Merlan. We will be consulting with him regarding the site's eligibility to the National Register of Historic Places.

The site is located in sandy terrain which is dissected by numerous small arroyos. The landform is hummocky. The major vegetation in the area consists of mesquite, yucca and snakeweed.

There is a light scatter of burned rock throughout the site. In addition there are numerous concentrations of burned rock or fire hearths. Many of these hearths are situated along the shallow arroyos, other are located in the flats away from the arroyos. The lithic material is not numerous but is scattered throughout the site. Lithics include quartzite cores and flakes, chert angular debris, retouched chert tools and a mano. No diagnostic artifacts were located on the site.

This site still has potential to provide information about the food processing activities of past cultures.



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
