

ABSTRACT

On August 22, 1988, the Division of Conservation Archaeology of the San Juan County Museum Association completed an archaeological survey of two proposed well locations for BHP Petroleum (Americas) Inc. The survey area is located in T24N, RIW, Sections 28 and 29, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico and is under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management. Approximately 23.02 acres were intensively inventoried.

Seven isolates and one site were recorded. The site is in the north and east buffer zones of Crane Fed 7-29. The documentation of the isolates in the field has exhausted their research potential. The Crane Fed 7-28 location is recommended for clearance. The Crane Fed 7-29 location is recommended for clearance with the stipulations as discussed in the report.

INTRODUCTION

On August 22, 1988, the Division of Conservation Archaeology (DCA) of the San Juan County Museum Association conducted an archaeological survey for BHP Petroleum (Americas) Inc. Englewood, Colorado. Chuck Williams of BHP Petroleum Inc. requested the survey and administered the project. Byron P. Johnson administered the project for DCA.

In recognition of the limited, nonrenewable nature of archaeological remains, the federal government has enacted legislation that is designed to conserve and protect these resources. The principal legislation includes the Antiquities Act of 1906 (PL 52-209), the Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (PL 89-665) and, as amended (PL 96-515), the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-852), the 1971 Executive Order No. 11593, the Archaeological and Historical Conservation Act of 1974 (PL 93-291), and the Archaeological Resources Protection Act of 1979 (PL 96-95). In addition, the Navajo Nation and the states of Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, and Colorado have enacted laws to ensure compliance with federal legislation and to protect archaeological resources within their jurisdiction. Work undertaken in the course of this project is intended to comply with these statutes and is governed by the stipulations of Cultural Resource Use Permit No. 7-2920-87-D (NM BLM).

Jerry D. William, DCA archaeologist, surveyed the project area for cultural remains.

METHODS

The well pads and pad buffer zones were surveyed by an archaeologist (J. D. William) walking parallel transects 12-15m apart across the locations. Access roads were surveyed by walking a zigzag pattern across the road and buffer zones along the length of the proposed roadway. A buffer zone of 150 ft on each side of the well pads was included in the survey as well as a 50 ft buffer zone on each side of the access roads. All cultural remains were recorded. Those whose information potential exceeded what could be extracted during the survey phase were assigned site status. Other cultural remains were documented as isolated finds (IF). Pertinent environmental data were also recorded.

In addition to field inspection, the archaeologist conducted a search of the records at the DCA and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Farmington Resource Area offices to determine if any sites had been recorded in the project area. Site and project records required by the BLM and the New Mexico Historic Preservation Division were completed.

Previously Recorded Sites: Four previously recorded sites are located within a one mile radius of the project areas (see BLM Supplement #1, provided only to BLM). These sites are LA numbers 11848, 11849, 11850, and 32229. No information is available for these sites.

Description: The proposed location for well Crane Fed 7-28 is in the valley bottom of a south draining tributary to Almagre Arroyo (Figure 1). High, narrow, steep-sided ridges are present to the north and west of the location. The tops of these ridges are generally so eroded that they form an inverted V and provide no flat surface for vegetation. A small, sandstone boulder strewn hill lies just to the east of the survey area. The project area is cut by several small drainage channels which trend generally from the northwest to the southeast. A substantial channel occurs along the west edge of the survey area and cuts to the southeast through the south buffer zone.

The area is currently privately owned and used for grazing of livestock. Erosion has occurred over part of the area, but it is generally in good condition. The area is in scrubland with the vegetation consisting primarily of sagebrush (Artemisia tridentata), various grasses, and snakeweed (Gutierrezia sarothrae). Other types of vegetation present include pinyon pine (Pinus edulis) and prickly pear cactus (Opuntia sp.). The vegetation covers only ca. 10% of the ground surface.





Figure 2. Crane 7-28 survey area map.

Cultural Resources: Five artifacts were found and recorded as isolated finds (IFs). All of these were in the buffer zone areas (Figure 2). Table 1 presents information concerning these artifacts.

Recommendations: The impact to cultural resources in this proposed well pad area are judged to have been mitigated through the recording of their presence, type, and location. Archaeological clearance is recommended. The Bureau of Land Management will make the final clearance determination after review of this report.

Description: The proposed location for well Crane Fed 7-29 is in the valley bottom in the upper reaches of Almagre Arroyo (see Figure 1). The ridge line of the Continental Divide lies just 450m to the west of the project area. High, narrow, steep-sided ridges are present to the north, west, and south of the location. The tops of these ridges are generally so eroded that they form an inverted V and provide no flat surface for vegetation. A similar ridge is present ca. 1.0km to the east. The project area is cut by several small drainage channels which trend generally from the north to the south, but near the north edge of the pad channels converge from the east and west into a south flowing channel. A substantial channel flows parallel with the west edge of the location then cuts to the east through the south buffer zone.

The area is currently privately owned and used for grazing of livestock. Erosion has occurred over part of the area especially near the north end of the pad and within the north buffer zone. The area is in scrubland with the vegetation consisting primarily of sagebrush, various grasses, and snakeweed. Other types of vegetation present include juniper (Juniperus sp.), pinyon pine, rabbitbrush (Chrysothamnus nauseosus), and club cholla (Opuntia clavata), prickly pear, and small Echinocereus sp. cactus. A woodland area begins in the east buffer zone and this is the location where most of the pinyon and juniper trees are located. The vegetation covers ca. 40% of the ground surface.

Cultural Resources: Two isolated finds and one site were recorded during the archaeological survey of this pad location. The isolated finds are briefly defined in Table 1 and their locations shown in Figure 3. The site is located in the north and east buffer zones and beyond the proposed project area. Artifacts displaced from the site area by erosion occur scattered throughout the drainage in the east portion of the project area.

Site DCA-88-185: This site currently consists of a scatter of cultural material in and along a drainage in the north and east buffer zones and beyond the buffer zones to the east (Figure 4). A trash midden is located just beyond the east buffer zone. Most of this site was originally located on the top of a ridge, with apparently the only portion of the site on the valley floor being the trash midden. The level portion of the ridge top has been completely eroded away, destroying that portion of the site. Artifacts are

present from the thin ridge top to the bottom of the very steep ridge walls and are scattered well down the drainage to within the project area. Very small pieces of blue flagging tape around the site suggest that the site has been identified previously, but no record of this is present.

The trash midden is to the east of the project area. This midden is currently identified as a mound of soil and cultural material existing as an island within the drainage on the east edge of the project area. The cultural material is eroding out of the mound especially along the west side. A two-track runs across the drainage from east to west and alongside the midden.

Cultural material is very dense on the east and north sides of the ridge line. Artifact types include ceramics, chipped stone, groundstone, and bone. It is likely that other types of materials are present given the density of the cultural material. Diagnostic bone elements are present.

A short, broad, side-notched arrowpoint manufactured from a glossy black chert was present at the site. The distal tip of the point had been broken off during manufacture. It is plano-convex in cross section with the ventral face of the original flake blank being the plano surface. The point is 1.9cm (estimated) long, 1.4cm wide, and 0.5cm thick.


A second biface noted at the site is a large thin biface manufactured from a low quality chalcedony. The material has been heat-treated causing a reddish discoloration and a glassy texture over nonresharpened portions of the artifact. The point is slightly asymmetrical probably because of resharpening. It is triangular with side notches and a small, very shallow basal indentation. The distal end has been removed through a lateral snap. The point is probably a recycled Archaic point. It is 4.7cm long with a maximum blade width of 2.5cm and a basal width of 2.6cm. The point is biconvex in cross section with a maximum thickness of 0.8cm.

Ceramic material on the site included brownwares, graywares, and Gallina black-on-gray sherds. Ceramics at the site are estimated to number in the tens of thousands. Chipped stone is estimated to number in the thousands.

Recommendations: Although most of the cultural material in this site has been redeposited, the quantity and variety of materials present can provide information concerning site function, subsistence, and period of occupation. The midden contains intact cultural deposits. Clearance is recommended for this proposed well pad with the following stipulations:

- 1. The ridge line in the north buffer zone be left intact.
- 2. The site area, as identified in Figure 4, north and east of the right rear corner survey stake will be fenced to ensure that the site is not impacted by construction activities.

Final clearance determination will be made by the Bureau of Land Management after review of this report.




