Dear Mr. Bradshaw:

Reference is made to your application dated August 24, 1990 for a non-standard Rhodes-Yates-Seven Rivers gas well location for your existing Farnsworth "4" Well No. 11 which was drilled in 1961 and completed in the Langlie-Mattix Pool at a standard oil well location 480 feet from the North line and 990 feet from the West line (Unit D) of Section 4, Township 26 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico.

It is my understanding that the Langlie-Mattix zone will be properly plugged back and said well will be recompleted to the Rhodes-Yates-Seven Rivers Gas Pool, which pursuant to General Rule 104.C.II., is unorthodox. Further, the NW/4 of said Section 11 shall be dedicated to the well forming a standard 160-acre gas spacing and proration unit for said pool.

Furthermore, your letter of September 4, 1990 has been made a part of this application and should this recompletion be successful, then Meridian's intention to also recomplete the Farnsworth "4" Well No. 12 located in Unit E of said Section 4 in the Rhodes-Yates-Seven Rivers Gas Pool will be withdrawn.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of General Rule 104.F.I., the above-described unorthodox gas well location is hereby approved.
