
Dear Ms. Bradfield:

Reference is made to your application dated July 24, 1997 for an unorthodox "infill" gas well location for both the Blanco-Mesaverde and Basin-Dakota Pools for the proposed San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 206-M to be drilled 1625 feet from the South line and 2260 feet from the East line (Unit J) of Section 10, Township 27 North, Range 6 West, NMPM, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico.

Production from the Basin-Dakota Pool is to be included in an existing standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit comprising the E/2 of said Section 10 which is currently dedicated to your San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 206 (API No. 30-039-20848), located at a standard gas well location 1925 feet from the North line and 1190 feet from the East line (Unit H) of said Section 10 and production from the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool is to be included in an existing standard 320-acre gas spacing and proration unit that also comprises the E/2 of said Section 10 and is currently dedicated to Burlington's San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 24 (API No. 30-039-07125), located at a standard gas well location 1804 feet from the North line and 903 feet from the East line (Unit H) of said Section 10.

By the authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(d) of the "*General Rules for the Prorated Gas Pools of New Mexico/Special Rules and Regulations for the Blanco-Mesaverde Pool/Special Rules and Regulations for the Basin-Dakota Pool*", as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the above-described unorthodox "infill" gas well location for the San Juan "28-6" Unit Well No. 206-M is hereby approved.
