Dear Ms Munds-Dry:

Reference is made to the following:

(a) your application (**administrative application reference No. pKVR08-21133008**) submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division (the Division) in Santa Fe, New Mexico, on behalf of Chesapeake Operating, Inc. (Chesapeake), on July 28, 2008, and

(b) the Division's records pertinent to this request, including the Division's records pertinent to Administrative Order NSL-5858, issued on June 25, 2008.

Chesapeake requested to drill the above-referenced well as a horizontal well in the Bone Spring formation, at a location that will be unorthodox under Division Rule 111. Its application was approved by Administrative Order NSL-5858. In this application, Chesapeake seeks approval for a different proposed location, which is also unorthodox, for this well. The surface location, point of penetration and terminus now proposed for the well are as follows:

Surface Location: 1670 feet from the North line and 25 feet from the East line
(Unit H) of Section 31, Township 24 South, Range 29 East
Eddy County, New Mexico

Point of Penetration: Same as surface location.



Terminus 1670 feet from the North line and 350 feet from the West line
(Unit E) of said Section 31.

The S/2 N/2 of Section 31 will be dedicated to the proposed well to form a project area comprising four adjacent, standard 40-acre oil spacing units in the undesignated Willow Lake-Bone Spring Pool (66450). This pool is governed by statewide Rule 104.B(1), which provides for 40-acre units, with wells located at least 330 feet from a unit outer boundary. This location is unorthodox because a portion of the producing interval will be less than 330 feet from the eastern boundary of the project area, and therefore outside the producing area.

Your revised application on behalf of Chesapeake has been duly filed under the provisions of Division Rules 104.F and 1210.A(2).

It is our understanding that you are seeking this location in order to prevent waste by penetrating the maximum amount of the target formation within the producing area.


It is also understood that you have given due notice of this application to all operators or owners who are "affected persons," as defined in Rule 1210.A(2), in all adjoining units towards which the proposed location encroaches.

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Division Rule 104.F(2), the above-described unorthodox location is hereby approved.

This approval is subject to your being in compliance with all other applicable Division rules, including, but not limited to Division Rule 40.

Jurisdiction of this case is retained for the entry of such further orders as the Division may deem necessary.
