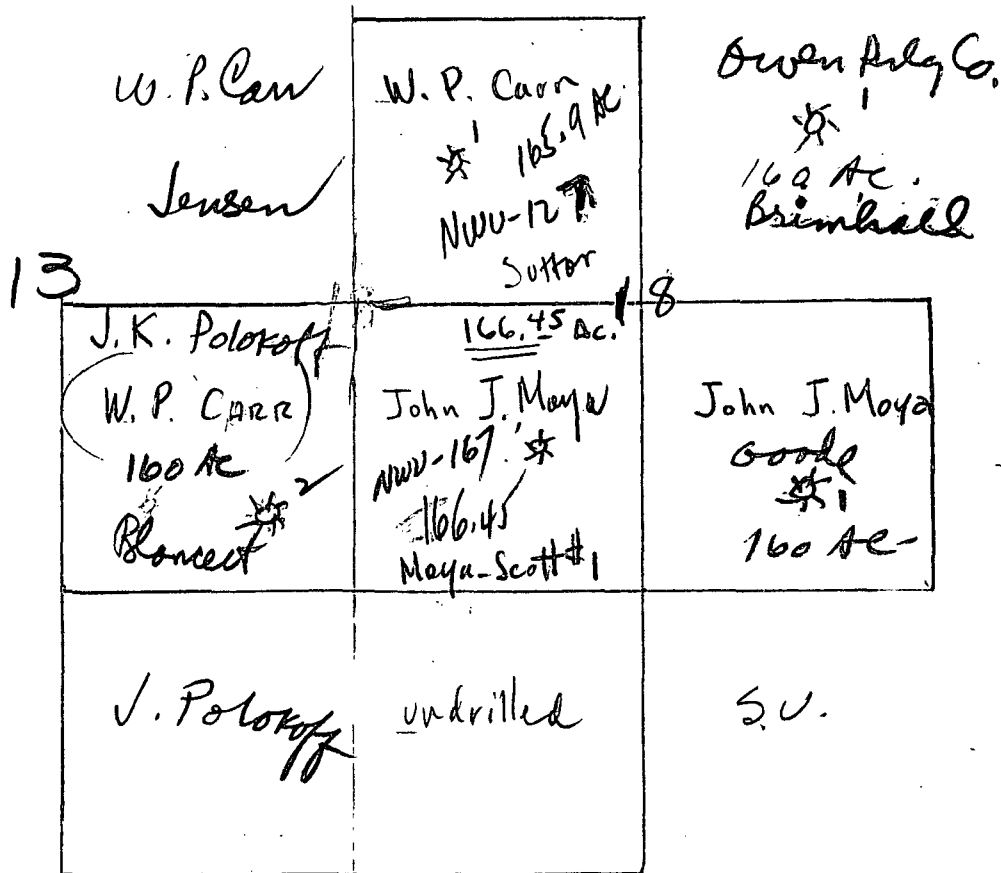

This is to inform that on February 17, 1956 the necessary forms required by the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of New Mexico concerning the unorthodox quarter due to variation of Sub-division of the Land Surveys within the unit of the Scott well. Also Application of approval of the same was submitted.

Will be a month before the application is approved as required by law in case of other off-set operator want to revised their notice of drill.

We are now in the process of blowing the well every two weeks, in order to, keep it clean and without accumulation of too much water or liquid gas.

The field engineer Mr. McConathy at Aztec, New Mexico notified me that the Deliverability test was done in the Scott well, he will submitte the necessary figures directly to the Oil and Gas Conservation Office.

Your Scott well abastract is at Farmington, and I forgot several times to bring it down. I am going up within the next week or so.- Will mail it to you.
