<u>AMENDED</u> AGREED COMPLIANCE ORDER

MAS Operating Co. (MAS) has demonstrated good faith in taking actions to return the wells identified in ACO-266 to compliance by reporting production on the Cooper #001, filing a notice of intent to temporarily abandon the OA Woody #001, and filing a notice of intent to plug the Rose Eaves #002. In addition, MAS has filed an application to amend its injection permit for the Knowles SWD #2 to address compliance issues with that well. Pursuant to Paragraph 10 of ACO-266, the Director of the Oil Conservation Division (OCD) amends ACO 266 to extend its terms as follows:

1. Bullet point 4 of Paragraph 7 of ACO-266 is replaced with the following:

Return each well to compliance with 19.15.25.8 NMAC by <u>November</u> 1, 2011 by taking one of the following actions: plugging and abandoning the well and obtaining its release pursuant to 19.15.25.10 and 19.15.25.11 NMAC; returning the well to production or injection and reporting that production or injection on a C-115, or placing the well on approved temporary abandonment pursuant to 19.15.25.13 NMAC.

2. Paragraph 8 of ACO-266 is replaced with the following:

If any of the wells MAS acquires from Platinum remains out of compliance with <u>any</u> provision of this order on <u>November</u> 2, 2011, MAS agrees that the OCD may plug and abandon the non-compliant well(s) and forfeit the applicable financial assurances. <u>MAS</u> <u>further agrees that it waives any right to notice and hearing prior to that plugging and forfeiture.</u>

3. The remaining provisions of ACO 266 remain in full force and effect.
