Re: Application of Aztec Oil & Gas Company for Administrative Approval for an Exception to <u>Rule 309(a) for Approval of the</u> Commingling of Oil from two Separate State of New Mexico Leases in Eddy and Lea County, New Mexico.

Dear Sir:

Pursuant to Rule 309(b), Aztec Oil & Gas Company, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant", hereby submits in triplicate its application for an exception to Rule 309(a) for approval of commingling into common tankage all oil produced from two separate State of New Mexico leases covering portions of Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, and Section 36, Township 16 South, Range 31 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy and Lea County, New Mexico. In support of this application, Applicant respectfully states and shows the following:

I.

Applicant proposes to commingle oil produced from the Robinson Pool into a Central Tank Battery which oil will be produced from its State of New Mexico Oil and Gas leases E-8233 and OG-5939.

II.

State of New Mexico Oil and Gas Lease E-8233 covers, among other lands not the subject of this application, the $E_2^1SW_4^1$ and Lot 4 $(SW_4^1SW_4^1)$ Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico. State of New Mexico Oil and Gas Lease OG-5939 covers Lot 3 $(NW_4^1SW_4^1)$ Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and the $E_2^1SE_4^1$, $SW_4^1SE_4^1$, Section 36, Township 16 South, Range 31 East, N.M.P.M., Eddy County, New Mexico. A plat showing the acreage covered by this application, the offset lease owners, Applicant's wells, and the proposed central tank battery location is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and by reference made a part hereof. Applicant's State "R" $\frac{1}{2}$ Well has been completed on the $SW_4^1SW_4^1$ Section 31, Township 16 South, Range 32 East, Lea County, New Mexico. Applicant's State "RC" #2 Well is presently drilling in the $NE_4^1SE_4^1$ of Section 36, Township 16 South, Range 31 East, Eddy County, New Mexico. The Central Tank Battery will be located adjacent to the State "R" #1 Well. New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission -2- September 25, 1959

III.

Pursuant to Rule 309 (b), Applicant states that:

- (1) Portions of the subject leases are contiguous.
- (2) All production is from the same common source of supply; i.e. Robinson Pool.
- (3) No more than 16 units will be produced into the proposed Central Tank Battery and Applicant proposes to accurately determine production from each well at reasonable intervals by the use of dump type meters.
- (4) Both of the subject leases were issued by the State of New Mexico and the production from both leases is dedicated to a common beneficiary; i.e. Common Schools.
- (5) So far as Applicant has been able to determine, all of the cffset leasehold and mineral rights owners have been furnished copies of this application together with a request that they consent to the proposed commingling of oil into a Central Tank Battery.

IV.

Since there is no market for the casinghead gas produced from the subject wells, it is being flared except for that portion utilized for lease operations; therefore, no action has been taken to separately measure gas production from the subject leases. At such time as a market is available, Applicant will establish appropriate methods of separatly metering such gas production.

WHEREFORE, Aztec Oil & Gas Company respectfully requests that the Secretary-Director of the Commission by administrative approval grant an exception to Rule 309 (a), without notice and hearing, and permit Applicant to commingle the oil produced from the subject leases into a Central Tank Battery as set forth above.


