tive approval to commingle the production of oil from six con-  
tiguous 40-acre tracts in the Langlie-Mattix Pool, Lea County,  
New Mexico, into one common tank battery.

The following is a description of the subject tracts:

Mattix Lease, W/2 NW/4 and N/2 SW/4, Section 2, T24S,  
R37E, Lea County, New Mexico

Chem-Mattix Lease, E/2 NW/4, Section 2, T24S, R37E,  
Lea County, New Mexico

Attached is a plat showing the six tracts and the off-  
set operators.

The six tracts are a part of State Lease B-9974 which was  
originally issued to Phillips Petroleum Company. Phillips Petroleum  
Company is the owner of four tracts, the Mattix Lease, and operator  
of all six tracts. Phillips Chemical Company, a wholly-owned sub-  
sidiary company, is owner of two tracts, the Chem-Mattix Lease. Thus  
the ownership is considered to be common.

1. All wells on the subject tracts are producing from a common source of supply, the Langlie-Mattix (Queen) Pool.

4. All offset operators were notified of this request on November 1, 1960.
5. A letter from the State Land Commissioner granting permission to commingle production from the subject leases is attached.
