1. Sunray Mid-Continent Oil Company's New Mexico Federal "P" Lease, SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 30, T-30-N, R-15-W, San Juan County, New Mexico.
2. Sunray Mid-Continent Oil Company's New Mexico Federal "L" Lease, Section 29, portion of the S/2 of Section 30, all of the N/2 of Section 31, and portions of the S/2 of Section 31, all in T-30-N, R-15-W, San Juan County, New Mexico.

All offset operators to the two leases were furnished copies of this application, and have returned signed waivers of objection to Sunray Mid-Continent's request.



Dear Sir:

Sunray Mid-Continent Oil Company operates two contiguous leases in Sections 29, 30 and 31, T-30-N, R-15-W, San Juan County, New Mexico.

The New Mexico Federal "P" lease contains only 40 acres consisting of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30, T-30-N, R-15-W. With the #1 well now being completed, this lease has been developed and no other wells will be drilled to the Horseshoe Canyon Sand.

The New Mexico Federal "L" lease in Section 29, and portions of Sections 30 and 31, T-30-N, R-15-W, has one well completed in the Horseshoe Canyon, also. The New Mexico Federal "L" #1 was completed approximately one year ago, and has produced approximately five barrels of oil per day for the last six months. This lease is equipped with a heater treater and two-tank tank battery. We have installed a header on the New Mexico Federal "L" lease sufficient to test each well at frequent intervals.

Approval has been received from the overriding royalty interest owners of the New Mexico Federal "P" lease to co-mingle the produced oil as provided in the New Mexico Oil and Gas Commission Statewide Rule 309, titled, "Central Tank Batteries".

We respectfully request that the United States Geological Survey approve the co-mingling of oil produced from the two leases as described above without the requirement of separate meters for each lease.

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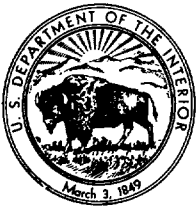
