Dear Mr. Losee:

Reference is made to your application dated July 10, 1964, wherein you request an amendment to Administrative Order CTB-102 to include the Wiley State Lease No. B-2175 comprising the SW/4 SW/4 of Section 36, Township 16 South, Range 29 East, in the commingling authority contained therein. It is our understanding that although the three leases which you propose to commingle, namely, the Leonard State Lease, the Nellis State Lease, and the Wiley State Lease, do not have identical ownership throughout, they have been consolidated by a communitization agreement which has been approved by the Commissioner of Public Lands for the State of New Mexico. Further, that the Commissioner has approved this application to commingle.

Administrative Order CTB-102 is hereby amended to include the subject Wiley State Lease.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of September 1, 1964, and also to approve the above captioned request to commingle production.

We are sorry that we had not approved this request before, but your letter of August 3, 1964, was misplaced.

This approval, however, is granted on the condition that the Commissioner of Public Lands reserves the right to amend or withdraw his approval should a loss of royalty occur at any time to the State of New Mexico.
