Gentlemen:

TEXACO Inc. respectfully requests administrative approval for permit to commingle production from <u>W</u>. L. Mix Well No. 2 with that from W. L. Nix Well No. 1, Drinkard Pool, Lea County, New Mexico. In support of this request, the following is stated:

1. Both W. L. Nix Well Nos. 1 and 2 produce from the common Drinkard Pool source.

2. The W. L. Nix Lease consists of the E/2 SW/4 and W/2 SE/4 of Section 17 and E/2 NW/4 and W/2 NE/4 of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 38 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

3. A diversification of working interest ownership exists between Well Nos. 1 and 2. TEXACO Inc. is operator of the W. L. Nix Lease and is 100% owner of Well No. 1. Gordon M. Cone owns part interest in Well No. 2 and a copy of this application is being sent this date to the part interest owner at P. O. Box 1148, Lovington, New Mexico, by registered mail.

4. Gas from each well shall be separately measured by the gas purchaser and the oil shall also be separately measured from each well with temperature compensated positive displacement meters with non-reset counters and fluid samplers, all of an approved kind for commingling production having diversified ownership. No well testing facilities shall be installed since the production from each well shall be continuously measured.

5. Attached is a diagrammatic sketch of the proposed tank battery and lease plat.

6. Texas-New Mexico Pipe Line Company is the purchaser on the W. L. Nix Lease and a copy of this application is being sent to them at P. O. Box 1510, Midland, Texas, by registered mail.

In view of the aforementioned and in accord with Statewide Rule 309-B, TEXACO Inc. would appreciate receiving the requested permit that will grant exception to Statewide Rule 309-A.


